1 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Next item on the agenda is

- 2 Case Number 15855. It's a status conference in the
- 3 application of Delaware Energy LLC to revoke the injection
- 4 authority granted under SWD 1680 for the Alpha SWD Number 1
- 5 well operated by Alpha SWD Operating Company out of Eddy
- 6 County, New Mexico. Counselors, are you on?
- 7 MR. FELDEWERT: Good morning, Madam Chair,
- 8 members of the Commission, Michael Feldewert of the Santa Fe
- 9 office of Holland & Hart appearing on behalf of Delaware
- 10 Energy, LLC.
- 11 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Good morning.
- MS. HARDY: Good morning, Madam Chair,
- 13 Commissioners, Dana Hardy with the Santa Fe office of Hinkle
- 14 Shanor on behalf of Alpha SWD Operating LLC.
- 15 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: You are coming in a little
- 16 quiet for me. Can everybody else hear Ms. Hardy?
- 17 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: She is a little quiet as
- 18 well, Madam Chair.
- MS. HARDY: Let me turn up my volume. My headset
- 20 wasn't working.
- 21 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: When you got a little
- 22 closer, it got better.
- 23 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: You sound good now.
- MS. HARDY: Great. Thank you.
- 25 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. All right.

1 Counselors, would you, starting with Mr. Feldewert, like to

- 2 make any brief statements on behalf of your clients?
- MR. FELDEWERT: Madam Chair, members of the
- 4 Commission, this case has a tortuous history that started
- 5 back in October of 2016, and, as you know, resulted in a
- 6 decision from the First Judicial District Court here in
- 7 Santa Fe that resulted in the remand or essentially
- 8 remanding the case back to the Commission to address what is
- 9 Alpha SWD's de novo appeal of the Division order that
- 10 revoked Alpha's injection authority.
- 11 So we have a Division order in place now that
- 12 revoked Alpha's injection authority. They have filed a de
- 13 novo appeal. That is where things get a little haywire with
- 14 respect to the Commission proceedings resulting in the
- 15 district court decision that it is now back before the
- 16 Commission under Alpha's de novo appeal of the Division
- 17 order R-14484-A.
- 18 So since it's Ms. Hardy's client that has the de
- 19 novo appeal, I'm going to punt to her because I'm not sure
- 20 what they want to do and where things stand, necessarily
- 21 with the parties. I know there's been some discussions
- 22 between the parties. Those have been going on for a long
- 23 time.
- I'm not sure -- I can't -- I really don't have
- 25 any information on whether they are productive or not. So

- 1 I'm going to leave it to Ms. Hardy to at least give the
- 2 Commission an idea of where she thinks it stands and what
- 3 they want to do with their de novo appeal.
- 4 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you, Mr. Feldewert.
- 5 Ms. Hardy, would you like to address the Commission?
- 6 MS. HARDY: Yes, Madam Chair. And I just wanted
- 7 to briefly mention that I'm sure the Commission is aware
- 8 that this case has been continued numerous times, and the
- 9 reason for the continuances has been the parties were
- 10 negotiating to reach resolution. I am opt -- well, maybe I
- 11 shouldn't be optimistic -- I'm hopeful they may still be
- 12 able to reach a resolution.
- 13 At this point, I think since the case has been
- 14 remanded and is pending back before the Commission, the
- 15 status really would be that Alpha had filed a motion to
- 16 dismiss Delaware's applications for a lack of standing, and
- 17 that was filed with the Commission in November of 2018, and
- 18 that motion was never ruled on because the Commission
- 19 subsequently determined that the Division lacked
- 20 jurisdiction and that ultimately resulted in the district
- 21 court.
- 22 So my thinking is that the best way to proceed is
- 23 maybe for the Commission to issue a ruling on that motion,
- 24 and that would then allow the parties to determine -- or
- 25 Alpha, rather, to determine how to proceed and whether they

- 1 want to go forward with the de novo hearing.
- 2 MR. MOANDER: Ms. Hardy, this is Chris Moander.
- 3 Was there an actual hearing held on that motion, because
- 4 what I'm trying to figure out is whether the parties want or
- 5 need a hearing on that motion, or if one was already done,
- 6 approximately when that was. Because I think that issue
- 7 predates, obviously, my involvement with the Commission, but
- 8 I think if I remember, that may even predate the current
- 9 Chair. So I want to make sure the parties get their proper
- 10 hearing.
- 11 MS. HARDY: Right. And it predates me, also,
- 12 actually with respect to this case. And I reviewed the
- 13 record. I think the parties discussed the motion, but I
- 14 don't know that a hearing was actually held, and maybe Mr.
- 15 Feldewert can answer that question.
- 16 MR. FELDEWERT: Unfortunately, yes, because I
- 17 guess I'm the only one who was around at the time this was
- 18 occurring. If you look at the record, and in fact, I think
- 19 the district court decision has a pretty good summary of
- 20 what occurred, it would be helpful, I'm sure, for the
- 21 Commissioners and perhaps or counsel to review. But
- 22 essentially what happened is in the -- in October before
- 23 there was a change in administration, the prior Commission
- 24 had gotten together, looked at the issues and Alpha wanted
- 25 to pursue their standing motion, so they said they would

1 have a hearing and have oral argument on the standing motion

- 2 and they wanted the parties to, at the same time at that
- 3 hearing, to address the proper remedy for the defect that is
- 4 undisputed with respect to Alpha's permit.
- 5 So there was every anticipation back in October
- 6 of 2019, I quess it was -- actually 2018 -- that there was
- 7 going to be a hearing on the standing motion, and then the
- 8 parties would also address the proper remedy to deal with
- 9 the defect in the issuance of the Alpha permit.
- 10 That hearing did not happen. And instead there
- 11 was a change in administration. There was a change in
- 12 course. The Commission decided to issue a decision that
- 13 they didn't have jurisdiction. That's what resulted in the
- 14 decision to the district court, which reversed that, and now
- 15 we are back to I quess where we would have been in October
- 16 of 2018.
- 17 So I think, you know, there is two ways you can
- 18 go. I think the district court opinion actually is very
- 19 informative, at least from my perspective, on the issue of
- 20 standing and what's not disputed here. But the Commission
- 21 can certainly take a look at the standing issue and then
- 22 also address how -- what remedies makes the most sense to
- 23 deal with this defect in the issuance of Alpha's permit --
- 24 or simply uphold the Division's order that was issued in
- 25 14484-A.

1 MR. MOANDER: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Feldewert, I

- 2 appreciate that quick run-down. It sounds like to me that
- 3 at least -- well, would the parties anticipate a motion
- 4 hearing on this to be terribly long? I mean, I have looked
- 5 at the rule and some other things, but really what I'm
- 6 asking is, do I -- does either party feel strongly that a
- 7 hearing would be beneficial? Because I'm inclined to think
- 8 it would be, but I also don't want to hoist that on anybody
- 9 or have the Commission hoist it on anybody.
- 10 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: I might just say that, you
- 11 know, since I think there's such a long history, I don't
- 12 think this Commission has that history other than I quess
- 13 reading through the district court opinion. And in order to
- 14 make an informed decision, that might be helpful. I'm open
- 15 to other ideas. But whatever, whatever the path forward, we
- 16 need to make sure that the Commission has all of the
- 17 information that's necessary in order to make an informed
- 18 decision.
- 19 MS. HARDY: On behalf of Alpha, Madam Chair, I
- 20 think we would be okay either having a hearing on the motion
- 21 or not, but whatever would be most helpful for the
- 22 Commission would be fine.
- 23 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: I mean, my inclination
- 24 would be to have a motion hearing.
- 25 MR. MOANDER: I think that's a good idea, Madam

- 1 Chair, that way we can get everything laid out, any new
- 2 information can be added by the parties, and we can just get
- 3 the record tidied up and get a supported finding from the
- 4 Commission.
- 5 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Commissioner Bloom, do you
- 6 have any thoughts or does that make sense to you?
- 7 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: That makes sense to me. I
- 8 would be in support of that. Thank you.
- 9 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. So I guess, I'm not
- 10 sure what the process would be. Probably work with
- 11 Commission Clerk Davidson to get on the calendar.
- MR. FELDEWERT: Madam Chair, the only thing I can
- 13 add, I think Ms. Hardy would agree with me on this, I don't
- 14 think the motion hearing would take very long. I think you
- 15 are looking at an hour or two at the most. I would think,
- 16 you know, depending upon your questions, but I can't see our
- 17 oral argument being all that long.
- MS. HARDY: Madam Chair, we do agree.
- 19 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. That's good to know.
- 20 All right. Well then on this matter, the parties will work
- 21 with probably both Mr. Moander and Ms. Davidson to make sure
- 22 we can get this schedule on the docket in the next coming
- 23 months.
- MS. HARDY: Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 25 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Mr. Moander, do we need any

Page 10 sort of formal motion on that? MR. MOANDER: We are scheduling another hearing, so I don't think -- that's not any Commission action, so I think we are okay. We just have to get it scheduled and then the Commission can vote on the particulars. CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. All right. Great. Thank you, Mr. Feldewert and the parties. MS. HARDY: Thank you. (Status conference concluded.)
