This matter came on for hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, William Brancard, Esq. Hearing Examiner, on October 21, 2021, via Webex Virtual Conferencing platform hosted by New Mexico Department of Energy Minerals and Natural Resources

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1 EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. We might do a few

- 2 hearings now, if we can. So I'm on Item 34 on the revised
- 3 worksheet. You have it in front of you. And these would be
- 4 cases 21837, 21838, 21839, 21840, Apache Corporation.
- 5 MS. BENNETT: Good morning, Mr. Examiner,
- 6 Deana Bennett, Modrall Sperling, on behalf of Apache
- 7 Corporation.
- 8 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 9 We have a number of other entries of appearance,
- 10 although it sounds like things may have been cleared out a
- 11 bit here on this matter. So let's see where we are. COG
- 12 Operating, LLC.
- 13 MS. MUNDS-DRY: Good morning, Mr. Examiner,
- Ocean Munds-Dry with COG Operating, LLC, and Concho Oil &
- 15 Gas, LLC.
- 16 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 17 I have Colgate Operating.
- MR. PADILLA: Mr. Examiner, Ernest L. Padilla for
- 19 Colgate Operating, LLC. We're appearing only to preserve
- 20 their rights.
- 21 EXAMINER BRANCARD: And then BF Petroleum.
- 22 MS. HARDY: Mr. Examiner, this is Dana Hardy with
- 23 the Santa Fe office of Hinkle Shanor. We had actually
- 24 withdrawn our appearance on behalf of BF. Their issues were
- 25 resolved with respect to these cases.

- 1 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 2 Any other interested persons for cases 21837, 838,
- 3 839, 840?
- 4 Hearing none, it is my understanding we were headed
- 5 toward a contested case here, but that the parties have
- 6 agreed to allow Apache to move ahead by affidavit; is that
- 7 correct, Ms. Munds-Dry?
- 8 MS. MUNDS-DRY: Yes. Thank you, Mr. Examiner.
- 9 We're close to resolving and getting toward an agreement.
- 10 So we have no objection to them proceeding today.
- 11 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 12 And I assume you're okay, Mr. Padilla, with that?
- MR. FELDEWERT: Yes, I'm fine with that.
- 14 MR. PADILLA: Okay. All right.
- 15 Ms. Bennett, are you ready to proceed?
- MS. BENNETT: I am, thank you.
- 17 As you noted, Mr. Examiner, the parties have rea- --
- 18 or have at least reached agreement that Apache can put these
- 19 cases on by affidavit today, which is what I'm planning on
- 20 doing.
- 21 I submitted exhibits in all four cases, a consolidated
- 22 exhibit packet for hearing purposes only. It means four
- 23 cases on Tuesday, and the exhibit packet contains the
- 24 affi- -- or self-affirmed declaration of Blake Johnson.
- 25 Mr. Johnson is the landman for Apache and he's previously

1 testified for the Division and his credentials have been

- 2 accepted as a matter of record.
- 3 I have also attached a self-affirmed declaration of
- 4 Drew Chenoweth. He's the geologist for Apache. He hasn't
- 5 previously testified before the Division, and so I have
- 6 included with his materials, his resume, which shows that he
- 7 has been a geologist since, I believe, 2013. He graduated
- 8 with an MS in geology, and he's worked in the Permian Basin
- 9 for a number of companies, including, most recently, Apache.
- 10 I would ask that his credentials be accepted as a
- 11 matter of record for purposes of this hearing, based on his
- 12 resume and his summary of his resume in his declaration.
- 13 I will briefly go through the exhibit packet and then
- 14 if -- I will stand for questions if anyone has any.
- 15 At the outside, these are four separate cases, and in
- 16 each case, Apache is seeking a standard 320-acre horizontal
- 17 spacing unit, and each spacing unit will be dedicated to two
- 18 wells; a second Bone Spring well and a third Bone Spring
- 19 well. And Apache designates its wells by the 200 series or
- 20 300 series; 200 being second Bone Spring and 300 being third
- 21 Bone Spring.
- 22 So behind the first set of materials in the exhibit
- 23 packet are the compulsory pooling checklists and there's one
- 24 for each case in order of the cases.
- 25 Next is the self-affirmed declaration of

1 Blake Johnson. As I mentioned, he has previously testified

- 2 before the Division and his credentials have been accepted
- 3 as a matter of record.
- 4 Next, I have included four applications; one for each
- 5 case. We then have the lease tract maps which shows the
- 6 leases at issue and the parties that are presented within
- 7 the leasehold, and that exhibit also includes a list of the
- 8 parties to be pooled by case number, and also a list of the
- 9 overriding royalties whose owners that Apache seeks to pool.
- 10 I have also included the C102s for each of the wells;
- 11 summary of Mr. Johnson's contacts with the working interest
- 12 owner, and in that summary, you'll see that after these
- 13 cases were filed, Colgate -- it is my understanding Colgate
- 14 acquired BF's interests. And as Mr. Padilla said today,
- 15 Colgate does not have any objections to these cases being
- 16 presented today.
- 17 I have also included a sample proposal letter and the
- 18 AFEs, and then my notice or a notice affidavit signed by me
- 19 that shows that notice was timely done in these cases.
- 20 Exhibit C is the geology affidavit or geology
- 21 exhibits. And Mr. Chenoweth has divided his exhibits into a
- 22 second Bone Spring geology study and a third Bone Spring
- 23 geology study. And behind his declaration you'll see the
- 24 usual suite of geology exhibits, including a structure map,
- 25 ice core, a horizontal -- a cross-section locater map, and

- 1 then the cross-section itself. And then his conclusions
- 2 about the orientation of the well are in his declarations,
- 3 and also that he believes that these wells will -- are
- 4 justified from a geologic standpoint.
- 5 So with that, I will stop my presentation and I will
- 6 stand for any questions that the Division may have. Before
- 7 I do that, though, I ask the exhibits in case numbers 21837,
- 8 21838, 21839 and 21840 be admitted into the record in each
- 9 of the cases.
- 10 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 11 Ms. Munds-Dry, any questions.
- MS. MUNDS-DRY: No questions, thank you.
- 13 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Padilla?
- 14 MR. PADILLA: I don't have any questions, and I
- 15 have no objection to the exhibits being tendered.
- 16 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 17 Mr. McClure.
- 18 MR. MCCLURE: I have no questions.
- 19 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Wow. Okay, well, with that,
- 20 the exhibits in cases 21837 through 840 will be admitted.
- 21 The credentials of your witness of your witness will be
- 22 accepted as an expert in 21837, 21838, 839 and 840. Unless
- 23 there are any other comments from any other person at this
- 24 point. It will be taken under advisement.
- 25 (Exhibits in cases 21837 through 21840 are admitted into the
