Page 3 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: With that, I call 2 Numbers 50 and 51, Cases 22334 and 22335, Mewbourne Oil 3 Company. 4 MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, Jim Bruce representing Mewbourne Oil Company. 5 6 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. And I have an 7 entry of appearance for a whole bunch of MRC entities. 8 MR. RANKIN: Mr. Examiner, Adam Rankin appearing 9 on behalf of MRC Delaware Resources, MRC Spiral Resources, 10 and MRC Explorers Resources. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Do you 11 12 have any objection to the cases going ahead by affidavit? 13 MR. RANKIN: We do not, Mr. Examiner. 14 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Are there any other 15 interested parties for Cases 22334, 22335. (No audible response.) 16 17 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, Mr. Bruce, you may proceed. 18 MR. BRUCE: Yes, Mr. Examiner, there are separate 19 exhibit packages for each case although they are virtually 20 identical. I will just go through the first one. 21 In Case 22334, Mewbourne seeks to pool the N/222 SW/4 of Section 3 and the N/2 S/2 of Section 4 in 18-29 for 23 24 purposes of drilling its Samsonite 3-4 B2KL Well Number 1H. 25 That application and proposed notice are Exhibit

Page 4 1. Exhibit 2 is the landman's affidavit, contains the usual 1 land plats, C-102s, lists the interests of the owners, and 2 3 notes specifically the parties being pooled by --4 designation by an asterisk among the various parties. 5 Contains a proposal letter, the AFE, all the 6 usual -- the overhead rates requested are 8,000 and \$800 a 7 month. 8 Number 3 is the geologist affidavit which is identical in both exhibit packages which contains the usual 9 10 structure isopach and cross section plats showing that the reservoir is continuous across the well unit. 11 Exhibit 4 is the affidavit of -- my affidavit of 12 13 mailing, and Exhibit 5 is the affidavit of publication, so 14 the interests owners did receive either notice by mail or 15 notice by publication. I have not received any return mail, so somewhere 16 at the federal postal system there are probably some green 17 cards coming back to me, but everyone did receive notice. 18 And finally, Exhibit 6 is the pooling checklist, so that 19 will be the exhibit package is complete. 20 In Case 22335, it's a similar identical listing 21 of exhibits, the only difference is that the acreage being 22 being pooled is the S/2 SE/4 of Section 3 and the S/2 S/2 of 23 24 Section 4. 25 I believe all the information that -- that the

Page 5 Division usually requests is in there, so I would ask that 1 the matters -- the exhibits be admitted into the record and 2 the matters be taken under advisement. 3 4 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Mr. Rankin, any questions? 5 6 MR. RANKIN: No questions and no objections. 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Mr. 8 Rose-Coss? 9 TECHNICAL EXAMINER ROSE-COSS: No questions or 10 objections either. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. Mr. Bruce, 11 12 perhaps you can sort of walk me through the notice here. 13 I'm looking at your Exhibit 4, I think in the first case, 14 334. 15 MR. BRUCE: Okay. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: So it's hard to tell 16 from the certified mailers when this was sent out. Would we 17 assume that the date that's on your attachment A, November 18 10 is the date it would have been mailed? 19 MR. BRUCE: Yes, Mr. Examiner. I do not -- I 20 mail them through the Pack Mail over on Montezuma Street, 21 and they do not date them like they do at the post office. 22 23 The reason I use them is because they are about -- it only 24 takes me ten minutes over there, whereas it would probably 25 take me an hour at the post office getting everything

Page 6 1 stamped. 2 But I -- I actually try to get there, like 3 November 10, I actually prepared these on November 9, and I 4 put the 10th down in case I didn't get out to mail them on 5 the 9th, but that is my usual procedure. 6 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. I was just 7 noticing because the delivery dates are like November 22, 8 November 24. It might just be holidays slowing everything 9 down. 10 MR. BRUCE: I don't know, but I have some that I mailed out for an upcoming case, I mailed to Chevron and it 11 12 wasn't delivered for three weeks. 13 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Wow. 14 MR. BRUCE: I'm always concerned about that and 15 getting all of those mailings back. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: At this point I don't 16 17 see any returns; right? 18 MR. BRUCE: Correct. None of them are returned. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: So we would assume 19 that you didn't really need the newspaper notice? 20 21 MR. BRUCE: Well, I started doing them, newspaper notices on almost all of them just in case something like 22 23 Chevron happens. 24 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Absolutely. I think 25 it's a good idea. Because I think you missed the newspaper

1 deadline by a day. 2 MR. BRUCE: Oh, I did? 3 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Yeah, because the 4 trick here is, it's ten business days, but Thanksgiving is a 5 holiday under New Mexico law. 6 MR. BRUCE: Ah. I thought ten business days. 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Well, I actually 8 looked it up, it's in the statutes. Black Friday is not legal holiday in New Mexico, but Thanksgiving is. 9 10 All right. You wanted to go through that. I had essentially the same questions for the next two cases, so I 11 12 think you have answered them all at this point. 13 MR. BRUCE: Okay. I will, at the end of the 14 hearing I will continue -- may I continue them to the 16th 15 for publication purposes? HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: If you would like to 16 do that, that's fine, yeah. That would be useful, yes. 17 MR. BRUCE: I will do that. 18 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Are there any other 19 interested persons for Cases 22334, 22335? 20 21 (No audible response.) HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, the 22 exhibits will be admitted into the record, and cases are 23 24 taken under advisement, but continued to December 16 solely 25 for fulfilling notice requirements. Thank you.
