- 2 EXAMINER BRANCARD: No. 44 on our worksheet
- 3 today is Case 22402, Longfellow Energy.
- 4 MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you, Mr. Examiner. Sharon
- 5 Shaheen of Montgomery & Andrews on behalf of Longfellow
- 6 Energy.
- 7 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Any other interested persons
- 8 in Case 22402?
- 9 Hearing none, Ms. Shaheen you may proceed.
- 10 MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you.
- In Case No. 22402 Longfellow seeks to amend
- 12 the Order previously issued, R-21654 previously issued in
- 13 Case 21792. In that case the south half of Section 20,
- 14 Township 17 South, Range 28 East was pooled. The Order
- was entered April 13th of 2021.
- 16 The deadline for drilling is therefore
- 17 April 13, 2022, and in this application Longfellow seeks
- 18 to extend the time for drilling to April 13, 2023.
- 19 Longfellow has good cause for requesting an
- 20 extension of time. In the affidavit, which is .pdf page 6
- 21 in the exhibits previously submitted, paragraph 15,
- 22 Longfellow explains that there have been changes in its
- 23 drilling schedule due to current labor shortages and
- 24 supply chain issues resulting from Covid 19 policies, as
- 25 well as delays in obtaining the necessary rights of way

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- 1 relating to infrastructure that will be used for the well.
- 2 Longfellow then provides a couple of
- 3 examples. One relates to construction delay on a pipeline
- 4 due to unanticipated months of negotiations for the
- 5 necessary right-of-way. And another example:
- 6 Longfellow plans to test the productivity from three other
- 7 nearby wells which have been drilled but not completed
- 8 because Longfellow was unable to obtain a frac crew until
- 9 February of this year, and then peak flow rates for those
- 10 wells are not projected until about 90 days after flowback
- 11 begins.
- 12 Again, if you take a look at the Table of
- 13 Contents, the landman here has previously testified before
- 14 the Division and had his credentials accepted. The usual
- 15 attachments for this type of application are the
- 16 Application, the previous Order, the Notice Letter, and of
- 17 course my Affidavit of Notice.
- 18 Uhm, with respect to Notice, publication
- 19 was delayed. I had an experience similar to Mr. Bruce's
- 20 in that we submitted the Notice for publication about a
- 21 week before it needed to be published, but it was not
- 22 published until December 26th. So I would ask that this
- 23 case be continued to January 20th so that I can confirm
- that (inaudible) will be entering an appearance.
- 25 I did attach the Affidavit of Publication

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- 1 to the exhibits, so that is in the record.
- 2 And if no one has any other questions, I
- 3 would ask that this case be taken under advisement and
- 4 that the exhibits are admitted into the record.
- 5 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Mr. Garcia,
- 6 questions?
- 7 EXAMINER GARCIA: No questions.
- 8 EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. So we will need
- 9 to continue this case with the Notice issue.
- I will note, Ms. Shaheen, that maybe you
- 11 need to be a little more careful with your affidavits
- 12 here, because your affidavit indicates that you caused
- this all to be mailed on December 14; however, the letter
- 14 that you sent out is dated December 17. Looks like from
- 15 the postal cards that it was actually mailed on December
- 16 17th.
- 17 Anyway, just watch that statement on an
- 18 affidavit.
- 19 MS. SHAHEEN: I'll again endeavor to make sure
- 20 my affidavit is correct.
- 21 EXAMINER BRANCARD: So we will continue this
- 22 case to January 20th for the purpose of Notice compliance.
- 23 Are there any other interested persons for
- 24 Case 22402?
- 25 Hearing none, we will admit the exhibits

Page 6 into the record and the case will be taken under the advisement but continued to January 20th -- the case will be continued to January 20th for compliance of Notice requirements. Thank you. And you don't have to file a continuance. MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you very much. (Time noted 9:34 a.m.)
