- 4 MS. SHAHEEN: Good morning, Mr. Examiner.
- 5 Sharon Shaheen, Montgomery & Andrews on behalf of Siana

- 7 MS. HARDY: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. Dana
- 8 Hardy with the Santa Fe office of Hinkle Shanor on behalf
- 9 of Mewbourne on Case No. 22378.
- 10 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Bruce, are you
- 11 representing Mewbourne in the other case?
- MR. BRUCE: Yes, I am, sir.
- 13 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay.
- We have an accounting issue here, it
- 15 appears. Mr. Bruce, you indicated you might be filing a
- 16 Motion to Dismiss.
- MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, in my case I will be
- 18 filing a Motion to Dismiss. There's no accounting issue
- 19 in my case. The facts of my case are simple, and I will
- 20 be filing a Motion to Dismiss, and even if it goes to
- 21 hearing I want it heard separately from the other case
- 22 because, I think Ms. Hardy can concur, the facts are
- 23 completely different, and therefore I would request a
- 24 separate hearing \*\* whenever. But at this point I will be
- 25 filing, hopefully next week, a Motion to Dismiss.

1 MS. HARDY: I agree, Mr. Examiner, that the

- 2 cases should be heard separately. The case I'm handling
- 3 involves specific accounting issues under the specific
- 4 Orders on different requests for relief and different
- 5 facts, so I think it would really only confuse matters to
- 6 hear the cases together.
- 7 EXAMINER BRANCARD: So, Ms. Hardy, you were
- 8 thinking that your Case 378 will go forward as an
- 9 evidentiary hearing?
- 10 MS. HARDY: I believe yes, that's correct.
- 11 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Ms. Shaheen. We were all
- 12 here at the Division surprised to see Siana re-emerging,
- 13 so what is the position of your client?
- 14 MS. SHAHEEN: Well, I think it would be more
- 15 expedient for the cases to be heard together. If not, I
- 16 believe that 22378 should be heard first, because I
- 17 believe that the evidence that will be submitted in that
- 18 case will also relate to 22439. If there's some way we
- 19 could incorporate part of the record in the first case in
- 20 the second case I would like to make that request, rather
- 21 than repeating the same testimony in both cases.
- 22 It might be a solution to set them both for
- 23 contested hearings on the same day, if you think that
- 24 would be expedient for the Division.
- 25 EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right.

I would propose that we set these cases

- 2 also for April 21st. We will set them as contested
- 3 hearings, but obviously if there's a Motion to Dismiss in
- 4 -439, that would then obviate the need to have an
- 5 evidentiary hearing.
- 6 MR. BRUCE: I --
- 7 EXAMINER BRANCARD: So -- Mr. Bruce, sorry.
- 8 MR. BRUCE: I was just going to say one reason I
- 9 don't want to sit through both cases together is my
- 10 presentation would be very brief, and I don't want to sit
- 11 through what could be hours of testimony in the other
- 12 case.
- 13 EXAMINER BRANCARD: You've got other things to
- 14 do?
- 15 MR. BRUCE: I have no life other than this, Mr.
- 16 Examiner.
- 17 EXAMINER BRANCARD: Well, we'll try to figure
- 18 out a way to expedite this. And I think it partly will
- 19 depend on what's in your motion and the response to the
- 20 motion.
- MR. BRUCE: Thank you.
- 22 EXAMINER BRANCARD: So let's schedule these for
- 23 April 21st.
- MR. BRUCE: Okay by me.
- 25 EXAMINER BRANCARD: They are potentially
