REPORTER'S TRANSCRIPT OF VIRTUAL PROCEEDINGS July 8, 2022
SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO

This matter came on for virtual hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, HEARING OFFICER WILLIAM BRANCARD and TECHNICAL HEARING OFFICER DEAN McCLURE on Thursday, July 8, 2022, through the Webex Platform.

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HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: So Mr. Bruce, are you on the line?

MR. BRUCE: Yes, sir.
HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Excellent. So with that, I will call Case No. 22672. This is Number 59 on the worksheet, Mewbourne Oil Company.

MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, Jim Bruce on behalf of Mewbourne Oil Company.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
I don't know if anyone else is here but we'll try.

Sabinal Energy Operating?
MR. BRUCE: And Mr. Examiner, Sabinal has been dismissed from this application.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: That's right. Thank you.

COG Operating? And then finally NimTex Energy.

MR. BRUCE: And Mr. Examiner, I emailed you a little while ago. I finally got a response from NimTex and they agreed to the proposal to dismiss them from the application. And I will probably do a supplement filing just to include that email in the record of the case.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: And that will

1 be helpful. Thank you. Since they didn't file an 2 objection.

All right. With that Mr. Bruce, please proceed.

MR. BRUCE: And that will be very short, Mr. Examiner, so that you can get to the main event.

In this case, Mewbourne seeks to force pool a well unit in the Bone Spring formation underlying the $\mathrm{S} / 2 \mathrm{SW}$ quarter of Section 28 and the S/2 S/2 of Section 29, 20 South, 27 East, for purposes of drilling its Pinta 28/29 B3NM Fed. Com. Well No. 1H.

The application and proposed noticed are submitted as Exhibit 1.

Exhibit 2 is the affidavit of Braxton Blandford, landman for Mewbourne Oil Company. It contains the usual tract plats, the $\mathrm{C}-102$. The information on each tract, included in the well unit including those people who need to be forced pooled, a summary of communications with the interest owners, a copy of the proposal letter, and the AFE which is stated to be a fair and reasonable.

As usual, Mewbourne requests overhead rates of 8,000 per month while drilling, 800 a month while producing, and a 200 percent risk charge.

Exhibit 3 is the affidavit of Charles Crosby, the geologist. And it contains the usual structure map, cross section which shows that the target zone is uniform, almost uniformly thick across the well unit and is capable of being produced by a horizontal well and each quarter-quarter section contributes more or less equally to production. And there is production.

This is a third Bone Spring well and there is production data from offset wells submitted as Exhibit C3. There's not many wells in this area but there is some data, including a couple of new wells that have no data.

The survey calculation reports -- a survey calculation report for the well is attached as Exhibit 3D. When I get a horizontal survey plat, I will submit to that to the division but one was not available this week.

Exhibit 4 is my affidavit of notice. I will update this because $I$ have received additional green cards, and I will provide a spreadsheet showing service to the various people.

Exhibit 5 is the publication affidavit which was timely published and so everyone has received either actual or constructive notice.

And Exhibit 6 is the pooling checklist, which does not contain the pool name or pool code, which will I obtain and I will submit a revised Exhibit 6.

But with that, I think the application packet is complete and $I$ do request admission of Exhibits 1 through 6 and ask that this matter be taken under advisement.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
Mr. McClure, questions?
MR. McCLURE: Yes, Mr. Brancard, I just have one question for Mr. Bruce. Maybe I missed it, maybe I asked it yesterday, Mr. Bruce. Did we have a pool for the Bone Spring there?

MR. BRUCE: I believe there is one. And I will get that information and update the pooling checklist with that information.

MR. McCLURE: Okay. Thank you. No more questions.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
Just one thing, Mr. Bruce, I mentioned this yesterday. It might have been a companion case, you need to make sure that your legal publication includes the case number.

MR. BRUCE: Yes. I -- I recognized that,

Mr. Examiner. I almost always do. And I don't know what happened on this one. I guess I just -- to use the old term, spaced it out so ...

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: So I believe you said you need to submit some green cards, a notice spreadsheet, revise the checklist for pool codes. I think there was one other thing.

MR. BRUCE: Oh, the -- I will submit copies of the email from NimTex showing that they agreed to allow this matter to go forward.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Right.
Okay. Thank you. So are there any other interested persons for Case 22672?

Hearing none, this case will be taken under advisement with the record left open with a list of items that Mewbourne has to provide. Thank you.

MR. BRUCE: Thank you, very much.
