1	HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: With that I believe			
2	we have four cases, but maybe only two. So I will call			
3	cases 22929, 22930, 22931, 22932, Tap Rock Operating.			
4	MR. RODRIGUEZ: Good morning. Michael Rodriguez			
5	for Tap Rock Operating LLC.			
6	HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: I believe in two of			
7	these cases we have an appearance by EOG Resources.			
8	MR. PARROT: Good morning, this is James Parrot			
9	with EOG.			
10	HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: So, Mr. Rodriguez, I			
11	think you have a late-filed motion to dismiss; is that			
12	correct?			
13	MR. RODRIGUEZ: That's correct. However, I would			
14	like to provide a little more context, as I might be trying			
15	to call (unclear audio) see how this works out, but in a			
16	long-winded version of the events that occurred in the last			
17	48 hours, which is a more stressed and anxious version than			
18	I'm used to.			
19	But to summarize the circumstances pertaining to			
20	these two Bone Spring applications, which are 22929 and			
21	22930, they were originally set up as oil wells, and we			
22	noticed the pool was not correct.			
23	And when we received the correct pool from the			
24	Aztec OCD office, we realized that that pool pertained to a			
25	gas pool. And so we reached back out to the Aztec office to

confirm that that was the case given that nearby wells next to the wells that we are proposing, these allocations are in oil pools.

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We did that not hear back from OCD on Tuesday, which is why I filed a notice of dismissal around 5:30 last last night being it would be improper to file -- or go forward with those applications with oil spacing.

However, this morning at 7:50, the OCD got back to us and said these would actually fall into an oil pool, which we assumed -- which we were hoping for all along.

And since these -- the pool code (unclear audio) what is in the applications which are submitted today, which is also an oil pool, albeit incorrect oil pool compared to the one we were assigned, they share the same offset and spacing requirements, we request that we be allowed to withdraw our motion to dismiss and either move forward today as planned, or an alternative, continue the matters to the next docket on August 18 at -- which will allow time to submit revised exhibits reflecting the current pool code and move forward as well.

And I know this is all very confusing, and I'm sure it's -- but we are planning to drill these wells by the end of the year, and we believe that this matter be heard as as soon as possible as it's in the best interest of the parties. I throw myself at the mercy of the Division on how
