1 P R O C E E D I N G S

2 MS. SANDOVAL: My name is Andrienne
3 Sandoval. I am the Director of the Oil Conservation
4 Division. Will the other two Commissioners please
5 introduce yourselves for the record.

6 MR. BLOOM: Hi. Good morning,
7 everyone. My name is Greg Bloom, and I am the
8 designee of Commissioner of Public Lands. Thanks.

9 DR. AMPOMAH: Good morning. I am
10 Dr. William Ampomah. I'm a professor at New Mexico
11 Tech, and also designee of the Energy Secretary.
12 Thank you.

13 MS. SANDOVAL: Also with us is Chris
14 Moander, counsel to The Commission, and Florence
15 Davidson, clerk to The Commission.

16 First item on the Agenda is Approval of
17 the Agenda. A couple notes, case nos. 6 through 9 on
18 the Agenda were continued to January 12, 2023.

19 Mr. Moander, 10 and 11, are those being
20 formally moved?

21 MR. MOANDER: So, Madam Chair,
22 yesterday afternoon counsel for WPX Energy Permian
23 submitted a Notice of Dismissal for Case Nos. 23087
24 and 22506. So at this point, unless for some strange
25 reason there's opposition to that, Madam Chair, I

1 would construe those as dismissed.

2 MS. SANDOVAL: Okay. So then Case No.
3 22506 and 23087, which were numbers 10 and 11 on the
4 docket, will be dismissed and not heard today. With
5 those changes, is there a Motion to Adopt the Agenda?

6 MR. BLOOM: Madam Chair, I so move to
7 adopt the Agenda as modified.

8 DR. AMPOMAH: Madam Chair, I do second.

9 MS. SANDOVAL: Mr. Moander, would you
10 do a roll-call vote, please?

11 MR. MOANDER: Happily, Madam Chair.
12 Mr. Ampomah?

13 DR. AMPOMAH: Approved.

14 MR. MOANDER: Commissioner Bloom?

15 MR. BLOOM: Approved.

16 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair?

17 MS. SANDOVAL: Approved.

18 MR. MOANDER: The Motion carries.

19 MS. SANDOVAL: All right. Next item is
20 Approval of the September 8, 2022 Meeting minutes; is
21 there a Motion to Adopt the Meeting Minutes?

22 MR. BLOOM: Madam Chair, I so move.

23 DR. AMPOMAH: Madam Chair, I second.

24 MR. SANDOVAL: Could you do a roll-call
25 vote, please, Mr. Moander?

1 MR. MOANDER: Yes, Madam Chair.

2 Commissioner Ampomah?

3 DR. AMPOMAH: Approved.

4 MR. MOANDER: Commissioner Bloom?

5 MR. BLOOM: Approved.

6 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair?

7 MS. SANDOVAL: Approved.

8 MR. MOANDER: The Motion carries.

9 MS. SANDOVAL: All right. Onto item
10 no. 4, Update on Case No. 21872, which was Application
11 of Titus Oil & Gas Production for Approval of
12 Production Allocation. I believe Mr. Fuge is on the
13 line with EMNRD to provide an update on that, or to
14 answer questions, or both.

15 MR. FUGE: Good morning, Madam Chair.
16 I was asked to -- I provided an update at the last
17 Commission meeting, which I'm happy to recap, but I
18 believe I was asked -- I was asked to appear today to
19 address any questions after providing a copy of the
20 executed MOA with the Railroad Commission to
21 Mr. Moander who I understand distributed it to the
22 rest of the Commission. So I'm appearing today to
23 answer any questions that the Commission may have.

24 MS. SANDOVAL: Would you mind just
25 doing, like, the 40,000-foot view of what the

1 agreement was, and then, Commissioners, as you have
2 questions, you can ask them of Mr. Fuge.

3 MR. FUGE: Sure. I'm happy to. I
4 think as everyone will recall, Titus, you know,
5 presented its case to the Commission in seeking to
6 develop a cross-border well with surface facilities
7 located in New Mexico, but producing intervals in both
8 New Mexico and Texas from the same well bore. The Oil
9 Conservation Division, and ultimately the OCD, through
10 its Order, took the position that such development of
11 that nature could not proceed until there was an
12 imminent place between the Railroad Commission and the
13 OCD concerning the, you know, sort of, co-management
14 of such wells.

15 And so the MOA that I presented last
16 week that was executed earlier this year -- was fully
17 executed earlier this year, provides such a structure
18 for the OCD and the Railroad Commission to exercise
19 their, sort of, respective jurisdictions over the
20 facilities.

21 It includes provisions for allocation
22 of production from the well bore. It discusses, you
23 know, compliance with various regulatory requirements.
24 You know, the environmental -- for example, the
25 environmental requirements that might apply to

1 facility construction are going to be dependent upon
2 the location of surface facilities. It address
3 reporting; for the most part, reporting relating to
4 production. Whether it's water, venting, flaring, et
5 cetera, all are going to be in a proportional basis,
6 you know, tracking the same formula used to allocate
7 production.

8 And then it finally includes provisions
9 related to financial assurance. Any operator that
10 wishes to develop such a well has to maintain
11 financial assurance in both states, as if the wells
12 were exclusively there, and has to make available
13 information related to both gross and allocated
14 production and any other sort of reported volumes that
15 are required.

16 And then, finally, there are provisions
17 for the Railroad Commission and the OCD to coordinate
18 related to inspection and enforcement activities to
19 the extent such activities become necessary in the
20 future and share information.

21 So at a high level, it, again, you
22 know, reflects the coordination necessary for the, you
23 know, OCD and the Railroad Commission to exercise our
24 respective authority over the wells. At this point
25 there is only the one well that Titus has put forward,

1 but I understand from their submissions in the prior
2 case that those -- that there are additional wells
3 coming in.

4 I will close with this: You know, this
5 was an MOA that was delegated to the OCD to execute.
6 So it is not actually before the Commission for any
7 sort of approval, but it has been presented to the
8 Commission in satisfaction of the condition in the
9 Titus Order that required my office to provide
10 periodic updates to the Commission with the full
11 execution of the MOA. That -- you know, my office
12 views that condition as satisfied.

13 And with that, I'm happy to address any
14 specific questions.

15 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair, just a brief
16 note: I think that Mr. Fuge and I are in agreement.
17 It is -- I'll pull this out quickly, so we have an
18 accurate record. It's Order R-21831-A, paragraph 29
19 that requires Mr. Fuge, or someone from his office, to
20 appear every 90 days until an MOA is executed. At
21 this point it's my opinion, and I think Mr. Fuge
22 agrees with me, that that condition is satisfied. And
23 so his obligation, the agency's obligation to appear
24 before The Commission on this matter, is now
25 extinguished.

1 MS. SANDOVAL: Thank you for the
2 clarification. Commissioners, do you have any
3 questions regarding the agreement now that you have
4 had an opportunity to review it?

5 MR. BLOOM: Madam Chair, I don't know
6 that I've seen a copy of the final executed MOA, so if
7 that could be sent to me, I would appreciate it. I
8 didn't find it in my mailbox.

9 DR. AMPOMAH: Yeah. I can't find it
10 here.

11 MR. MOANDER: One moment. I will find
12 it for you.

13 MR. BLOOM: I don't have any questions
14 right now. And I don't expect to. Thank you.

15 DR. AMPOMAH: Madam Chair, I also do
16 not have any questions on that.

17 MS. SANDOVAL: Okay. Ms. Shaheen
18 appears to have a question. If it's brief,
19 Ms. Shaheen, you can ask Mr. Fuge.

20 MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you, Madam Chair.
21 First, Titus would like to thank the Division and the
22 Commission for all the work that they've done to make
23 this a possibility. And I'd like to personally thank
24 Mr. Fuge, as well. The one question that I have is I
25 understand that there will be a Notice to operators

1 that will be posted, and I'm just wondering if there's
2 an update on the timeframe when that may be posted?

3 MR. FUGE: My hope is that that will be
4 posted by the end of the week.

5 MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you very much.

6 MS. SANDOVAL: All right. Thank you,
7 Mr. Fuge. I think we can -- Commissioners, if there's
8 nothing additional, I think we can move on to agenda
9 item number 5.

10 All right. Agenda item number 5 is
11 Adoption of a Final Order in Case No. 22977. This was
12 the Application of Pinon Midstream to Amend Commission
13 Order No. R-21455-A. Is there a Motion to Adopt the
14 Final Order?

15 MR. BLOOM: Madam Chair, I so move.

16 MS. SANDOVAL: I will second that. And
17 then, Mr. Moander, would you, please, do a roll-call
18 vote?

19 MR. MOANDER: Happily, Madam Chair.
20 Mr. Ampomah?

21 DR. AMPOMAH: Approved -- no --

22 MS. SANDOVAL: One question, I'm sorry,
23 Mr. Moander, is Commissioner Ampomah voting on the
24 Final Order? I believe it's just Commissioner Bloom
25 and I.

1 MR. MOANDER: That's right. You are
2 correct. So Commissioner Ampomah should not vote on
3 this. With that in mind, we will do Commissioner
4 Bloom.

5 MR. BLOOM: Approved.

6 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair?

7 MS. SANDOVAL: Approved.

8 MR. MOANDER: The Motion carries. I
9 was just nervous when there's two votes, because then
10 you can get stuck.

11 MS. SANDOVAL: I will just note that
12 two is the majority in a Quorum, so we just need two
13 votes for it to be approved.

14 MR. MOANDER: That is correct.

15 MS. SANDOVAL: All right. As we
16 mentioned earlier, let's see, agenda item numbers 6
17 through 9 were continued until January 12th. And then
18 agenda items 10 and 11 were dismissed. And so that
19 will put us at agenda item number 12, which is pending
20 litigation.

21 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair, in the A-1-
22 CA-39578, which has been -- I've been updating pretty
23 much every meeting since, basically, last November or
24 October; it's been about a year. On October 5th, we
25 received Notice from the Court of Appeals that the

1 matter has been submitted to a three-judge panel for
2 consideration. So I'm anticipating we should, maybe
3 not by November, but I would think by December, we
4 should get an opinion on that.

5 D-101-CV-2002-00791 to the Ragsdale
6 matter; I don't believe we have a hearing set.
7 Luckily Ms. Shaheen is on this morning; she may know a
8 little bit more about that at the moment. But I think
9 we're just waiting for -- on a setting from the Court
10 to deal with at least preliminary issues and maybe
11 even proceed to a Merits Hearing.

12 MS. SANDOVAL: Okay. Are there any
13 questions?

14 DR. AMPOMAH: No.

15 MR. BLOOM: No, Madam Chair.

16 MS. SANDOVAL: All right. Any other
17 business? Our next meeting will be November 10, 2022.
18 And with that, we are done for the morning. Thank
19 you, everybody. And we will see you next month.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thanks,
21 everyone. Good-bye.

22 DR. AMPOMAH: Thank you.

23 (Whereupon, at 10:17 a.m., the
24 proceeding was concluded.)
