


HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: With that, we're on Item Number 55, Case 22744.

MS. VANCE: Good morning, Mr. -- I'm sorry, Mr. Brancard. Good morning Mr. Hearing Examiner, Mr. Lowe. Paula Vance with the Santa Fe office of Holland \& Hart on behalf of the applicant, Matador Production Company.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Okay. We have an entry of appearance here from Avant Operating.

MS. BENNETT: Good morning, Mr. Examiner and Mr. Lowe. Deana Bennett on behalf of Avant.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
Does Avant have any objections to this case going forward by affidavit?

MS. BENNETT: No, Mr. Examiner. Avant does not have any objections and $I$ don't intend to ask any questions. We're just -- I'm just entering our appearance to preserve any rights. Thank you.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: All right.
So Avant is the successor to WHWL; is that correct, Ms. Bennett?

MS. BENNETT: That is a question I don't have the answer to, but I'm happy to look into that if $I$ need to.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Okay. And you
know it was asserted in the application?
MS. VANCE: We included that in our -it's our understanding that's the nature of the relationship and $I$ believe it's in Exhibit or Sub Exhibit C-3 at the bottom there. And it may also -I believe we also covered that in Sub Exhibit C-6, if you have that up and available. But that's our understanding or least that's my understanding.

MS. BENNETT: And I'm happy to agree to that, subject to check.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Okay.
MS. BENNETT: But I did have
communications with Avant and they didn't have any objections to the application or anything stated in the application. So I'm happy to agree to Ms. Vance's characterization and then double-check if $I$ need to.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you. I just wanted to clarify a bit, but quite clearly Avant has received notice, has entered an appearance, and does not have an objection so we can go forward here.

Again, any other entries of appearance for 22744 ?

MS. BENNETT: And Mr. Examiner, this is

Deana Bennett again. I'm going to go ahead and drop off just because $I$ have to get to a meeting so I apologize.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
MS. VANCE: Thanks, Ms. Bennett.
HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Please go
ahead, Ms. Vance.
MS. VANCE: Okay. Thank you.
In case 22744, Matador seeks to pool an uncommitted interest within the Bone Spring formation, Pool Code 30213 underlying a standard 320 -acre horizontal spacing unit comprised of the E/2E/2 of Sections 28 and 33, Township 20 South, Range 33 East, Lea County in New Mexico.

Matador seeks to dedicate the spacing unit to the proposed Gavilon Fed Com 104 H well, Gavilon Fed Com 114 H well, Gavilon Fed Com, 124 H well, and the Gavilon Fed Com 134H well.

In this case, we have provided the compensatory pooling checklist as well as the affidavit and testimony of Landman Isaac Evans and Geologist Andrew Parker, both of whom have previously testified before the division. And their credentials have been accepted as a matter of record.

Mr. Evan's affidavit is Exhibit C, which includes Sub Exhibit C-1, the C-102s; C-2, the landman tract map; $C-3$, a list of uncommitted working interest owners; C-4, a list of overriding royalty interests, $C-5$, sample well proposal letters and $A F E$ and $C-6$, chronology of Contacts.

This is followed by Mr. Parker's affidavit and testimony which is Exhibit D and Sub Exhibit D-1, a locator map; D2, Bone Spring subsea structure; and D3, Bone Spring structural cross-section.

In this case, Mr. Parker did not indicate any faulting, pinch outs, or other geological impediments to horizontal drilling these wells. And lastly, our Exhibit E, a self-affirmed statement of notice with a sample letter, with a sample letter that was timely mailed on April 15th, 2022. And Exhibit $F$, the affidavit of notice of publication which was timely published on April 19th, 2022. And unless there are any questions, I would ask that all exhibits and sub exhibits be accepted into the record, and that Case 22744 be taken under advisement by the Division at this time. And I stand by --

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.

MS. VANCE: -- yeah, for any questions.
HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Mr. Lowe, any questions?

TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: Good morning, Ms. Vance.

MS. VANCE: Good morning, Mr. Lowe.
TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: I have few
questions on -- actually one question on your C-102s for all these wells. It looks like just from what I see on your C-102s, there all in the same location. They're right on top of each other. Is that just a, I mean, I didn't notice -- the $C-102 s$ indicate the surface location, the bottom hole location appear to be moved, but $I$ don't know if the take points are noted but they're noted in that lat. long. information.

MS. VANCE: That's correct.
TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: I was just curious to know, are they all stacked together, is that's what's going on?

MS. VANCE: Yes. And I believe if you go to Exhibit $D-3$, you can see how Matador intends to drill these wells with separation between each of the laterals through the vertical depth.

TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: What exhibit is
that one?
MS. VANCE: Exhibit D-3, the structural cross-section. You go there, you can see how Matador intends to drill these. They've got, if you look to the right-hand side, you can see 104 H , the target; 114 H well, the target; 124 H well, the target; and the 134 H , the well target.

TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: Okay. Thank you.

MS. VANCE: Thanks, Mr. Lowe.
TECHNICAL EXAMINER LOWE: I don't have any further questions.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Thank you.
My only nit is it doesn't take me much to get confused, and I got confused in Mr. Feldewert's statement. He refers to the publication notice as Exhibit E. I think it is actually Exhibit F.

MS. VANCE: You're correct. I apologize.
I am happy to refile that with the correction on there, if you'd like, Mr. Brancard.

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: I think that's fine.

MS. VANCE: I will make sure that we -would you like me to refile that?

HEARING OFFICER BRANCARD: Yeah, that will
