P R O C E E D I N G S

MR. FUGE: The Commission is here, and after conferring with the Attorney General, consistent with the Open Meeting Act, Commissioner Ampomah is appearing telephonically today. So I'm going to run through a quick roll call.

Commissioner Ampomah?

MR. AMPOMAH: Present.

MR. FUGE: Commissioner Bloom?

MR. BLOOM: Present.

MR. FUGE: And obviously, let the record reflect the Chair is here. Moving through the agenda, have my fellow Commissioners had an opportunity to review the agenda for today, this September 7, 2023, meeting of the Oil Conservation Commission?

MR. BLOOM: Yes. And I would move to adopt the minutes.

MR. AMPOMAH: Second.

MR. FUGE: Let the record reflect that the agenda was adopted unanimously.

Next item up, have you been able to review the minutes from the August 17, 2023, meeting?

MR. BLOOM: Yes. And I would move to approve those.

1 MR. AMPOMAH: And I'll second.

2 MR. FUGE: Let the record reflect the
3 minutes from the August 17, 2023, meeting were adopted
4 unanimously. Moving on to prior cases.

5 Moving on to Case No. 23580:
6 Application of Wild Earth Gardens in the matter of
7 Proposed Amendment to the Commission's Rules to
8 Address Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances
9 and Their Use in Oil and Gas Extraction.

10 The Commission received in advance of
11 the hearing consistent with the direction be provided
12 on August 17th, and a consensus proposal order for the
13 hearing in that matter.

14 Just for the record and the benefits of
15 the party, the only reason that order has not been
16 signed and issued is we're working on getting some
17 Webex meeting login information for that hearing to
18 determine whether it will either be the same login for
19 the whole hearing, which is what we're trying to do,
20 or if not, it's going to be different logins for
21 different days, but we want to just be able to
22 communicate that at once.

23 But the Commission, because the order
24 was joint, it will be signed and issued. The only
25 delay is a technical one, just getting the Webex

1 information and login set up. Do any parties in that
2 matter have any questions or concerns?

3 Moving through the agenda, obviously,
4 the other cases noted will be heard on November 9th.

5 New cases set for status conference:

6 Case No. 23727: Application of Targa
7 Northern Delaware LLC for Rehearing of Order No. R-
8 13507-E.

9 MS. HARDY: Good morning.

10 MR. FUGE: Ms. Hardy appearing for
11 Targa --?

12 MS. HARDY: Yes, thank you. I didn't
13 know if Jesse was entering the appearance. Are you?

14 MR. TREMAINE: Oh, I will, yes.

15 MS. HARDY: Okay.

16 MR. TREMAINE: And Jesse Tremaine for
17 Oil Conservation Division.

18 MS. HARDY: Okay. Thank you. Targa
19 and OCD are working out proposed conditions to include
20 in an order, and I expect we will be able to reach an
21 agreement on those. So we are hoping that we could
22 just submit that order to the Commission for approval.
23 I don't think we need a hearing unless the Commission
24 has questions for our witnesses. And if that's the
25 case, then we'd be happy to address them.

1 MR. FUGE: And remind me, the
2 Government L Com #001 Well, Targa had negated in
3 Commission earlier this year consistent with the
4 requirement of Order No. R-13507; right?

5 MS. HARDY: That's correct. We filed
6 our reports that were required by that prior order,
7 and then at the hearing the division recommended
8 permit conditions, and I think there was some
9 ambiguity on what those would include. And then the
10 order included monitoring conditions for the
11 Government L Comm well that really would normally
12 apply to an AGI well. The Government L Comm is a
13 partially plugged inactive well, so we need to have
14 different monitoring conditions with respect to that
15 well. And so that's what we are working on with OCD.

16 MR. FUGE: I think the Chair would be
17 fine receiving a kind of joint proposal, if it was
18 unopposed. I'm assuming any amendment you might make
19 to your end would not be subject to notice
20 requirements?

21 MS. HARDY: I think that that's true.

22 MR. FUGE: Okay.

23 MS. HARDY: Right, yes.

24 MR. FUGE: Okay. If the parties can
25 work it out, I don't see the need to set it up for a

1 hearing, but we will put it on the docket for the
2 October meeting just in case if there is a need for
3 discussion and presentation. But we can obviously
4 pull it down if the parties come in with a change
5 order and confirm that there are no notice
6 requirements with respect to changes.

7 MS. HARDY: That sounds perfect. Thank
8 you.

9 THE REPORTER: And can I ask who was
10 speaking for Targa?

11 MS. HARDY: This is Dana Hardy, with
12 Hinkle Shanor, on behalf of Targa.

13 THE REPORTER: Thank you very much.

14 MS. HARDY: Thank you.

15 MR. FUGE: Anything else for this
16 matter?

17 MS. HARDY: Not from Targa, Mr. Chair.

18 MR. FUGE: Jesse?

19 MR. TREMAINE: No, Mr. Chair.

20 MR. FUGE: Moving on to the following
21 cases which were referred to the Commission by the OCD
22 Director, 22827. That's the OCD order, but the cases
23 are 23686 and 23687. Since they were referred up to
24 the OCD/OCC for similar reasons, we might as well as
25 just cover them collectively rather than lumping

1 through them. Who is appearing for Chevron?

2 MS. BENNETT: Good morning. Deana
3 Bennett from Modrall Sperlring on behalf of Chevron.

4 MR. TREMAINE: Jesse Tremaine for the
5 Oil Conservation Division.

6 MS. BENNETT: Good morning. And thank
7 -- oh, I'm sorry.

8 MS. HARDY: I apologize. Dana Hardy
9 with Hinkle Shanor on behalf of Mewbourne Oil Company.

10 MR. FUGE: Okay.

11 MS. BENNETT: And I believe there's at
12 least one other entry of appearance from COG in this
13 Veritas case. I don't know if COG's on the Webex.

14 MR. FUGE: Do we have any party on the
15 line appearing in either of the current cases we're
16 discussing, 23686 or 23687?

17 MR. KOLUMCICH: Nicholas Koluncich on
18 behalf of New Mexico State Land Office and
19 Commissioner Stephanie Garcia Richard.

20 MR. FUGE: Thank you. I think there
21 was one other party, but you can proceed.

22 MS. BENNETT: Thank you. As the Chair
23 mentioned, or noted, we originally filed these cases
24 for the OCD to consider, and they were referred to the
25 OCC. And we're here today for a status conference to

1 discuss a hearing schedule. And I have had some
2 preliminary discussions with the OCD in terms of what
3 would work for potential hearing dates before the OCC.

4 And originally Chevron had been hopeful
5 that we'd be able to be before the Commission on
6 October 12th, but given competing priorities, that
7 date does not seem to be available. And so Chevron
8 would appreciate being able to have the hearing on
9 these two cases on November 9th. And in preliminary
10 discussions with the Division, that seems to be
11 workable for the Division as well.

12 And, of course, interested to hear from
13 Mewbourne. Mewbourne is no longer objecting to the
14 cases. Mewbourne had filed an entry of appearance at
15 the OCD and objected to the cases going by affidavit,
16 but they have since withdrawn that objection. And
17 interested in hearing from the State Land Office as
18 well, but are hopeful that the November 9th Commission
19 date would work for a hearing on these two cases.

20 MR. FUGE: OCD, do you have any
21 comments?

22 MR. TREMAINE: No. It sounds all
23 accurate, Mr. Chair. I think October was going to be
24 too problematic for those who needed to prepare for
25 this hearing. At this time, we believe that November

1 9th will work and if for some reason that changes,
2 I'll follow up with everyone immediately, but I
3 anticipate that working.

4 And we've had some preliminary
5 discussions about how long the hearing is -- will need
6 to be. It's a little too early to be quite specific,
7 but I think that OCD would have one or two witnesses,
8 and may proceed for one or no more than two hours.

9 MR. FUGE: And Chevron, will you .- for
10 the case?

11 MS. BENNETT: Thank you. We think we
12 would have between either three or four witnesses.
13 The usual suspects of course, land and geology, but
14 also a reservoir engineer and a petro physicist might
15 be in our lineup as well, to address the nuances of
16 these particular proposals. And we may also have
17 another witness, so I'd say between three and four
18 witnesses.

19 And we would probably need a half day
20 ourselves for the affirmative case, while, I mean that
21 also includes, of course, any questions from the
22 Commission or any other parties. So we would probably
23 need a half day.

24 And while the cases are combined, one
25 is in Lea County, and one is in Eddy County. And so

1 to the extent there are differences from a reservoir
2 engineering perspective or petro physics perspective,
3 we would want to proceed with the cases combined, but
4 there may need to be some different testimony based on
5 the different locations. So, again, that's a very
6 long explanation to say half day.

7 MR. FUGE: Counselors, do either of you
8 -- what do you anticipate your needs being?

9 MS. HARDY: Mr. Chair, based on
10 Mewbourne's withdrawal of its objection, we wouldn't
11 plan to present witnesses. We may have questions of
12 the witnesses for other parties.

13 MR. FUGE: Okay. And Mr. Koluncich, I
14 apologize if I mispronounced that, from State Land
15 Office, what do you anticipate your needs being, any
16 witness prep timing.

17 MR. KOLUNCICH: Thanks very much for
18 the opportunity to be heard. At this point, I only
19 caught wind of this matter yesterday, in our
20 appearance seven days ago. We'll definitely want to
21 cross the others' experts. We may realistically need
22 two or three hours if we put forth someone to testify,
23 so I'm anticipating a couple of hours.

24 MR. FUGE: All right. Thank you.

25 MR. KOLUNCICH: No, thank you.

1 MR. FUGE: I am looking ahead, based on
2 the minutes we just approved, and sort of what's on
3 the docket, we do you have a DeNovo pooling/spacing
4 case currently slated for November 9th, and we also
5 have the Potash/JITC matter of -- R1.11P, which was
6 also calendared for the 9th at the last meeting.

7 I'm a little concerned about docket
8 bandwidth there, given the potential for four
9 affirmative testimony in those cases. So would the
10 party be open, or are we causing significant injury if
11 we put this on the December docket, which I believe,
12 I'm looking at the Commission clerk as well as we
13 would like at the moment. It's an open docket,
14 because I'm hearing about a solid day's worth of
15 testimony between the OCD, Chevron, and then what I've
16 heard from the other parties.

17 MS. BENNETT: Thank you. I totally
18 appreciate the Commission's schedule. I'm wondering
19 if there's perhaps a compromise here that we could be
20 put on the schedule for November 9th, with the caveat
21 that if the DeNovo spacing unit case does move
22 forward, then we would go to December 14th. But if
23 that case gets continued, then that would open up the
24 Commission's docket for that date, if that's a
25 possibility?

1 MR. FUGE: I would be okay with that,
2 looking at my fellow Commissioners. Yep.

3 MS. BENNETT: Okay. I really
4 appreciate that. I know that sometimes those
5 Commission cases do get continued, and we would
6 definitely appreciate the opportunity to be on the
7 first available docket. So definitely appreciate your
8 compromise there.

9 MR. FUGE: We will put you on the 9th,
10 with that caveat. If the cooling and spacing case
11 does not continue, which is a possibility, you will be
12 the first up on the docket for the December meeting.

13 MS. BENNETT: And I suppose what we'll
14 need to do just amongst ourselves, is as the November
15 9th deadline approaches, if we haven't heard anything
16 from the parties to that pooling case, we may need to
17 affirmatively let you know that we want to move to
18 December 14th because of witness prep issues and
19 things like that.

20 MR. FUGE: Yep.

21 MR. BLOOM: Mr. Chair, my only concern
22 would be that parties have enough time to be prepared
23 for November.

24 MR. FUGE: I can ask Commission Counsel
25 to follow up with Counsel on the pooling cases, so we

1 can try to get some clarity in advance of our first
2 agenda publication under OCC rules to see if we can
3 get some clarity. If we don't get it soon, we'll make
4 that call early on when it goes, in fairness to all of
5 the parties.

6 MS. BENNETT: Thank you.

7 MR. FUGE: That was the last item on
8 the agenda under pending litigation. This is
9 primarily the agenda. There was no update, but just a
10 quick update to the Commission record. A motion to
11 dismiss was filed on Friday, September 1st. And the
12 OCD joins with the -- status update there.

13 In other business, just a heads up
14 again, -- we are working on setting up our schedule
15 for 2024 for OCT hearings. Normal cadence kind of
16 standard scheduling, maybe with some tweaks to
17 accommodate the fact that we do have that weeklong
18 rulemaking hearing in February.

19 And otherwise, we are resuming our
20 regular meeting cadence. Appreciate everyone's
21 flexibility, understanding overlaps, our next meeting
22 will be October 12, 2023. Details and locations to
23 come. We're close on -- but maybe not quite there by
24 the actual meeting.

25 So, thank you, everyone. Have a good

1 day. With that, I will adjourn the meeting unless
2 there's anything else.

3 MR. AMPOMAH: Thank you.

4 THE REPORTER: Off the record at 9:18


