Dear Mr. Anderson:

This letter will confirm my telephone call to your agency regarding the planning meeting to be held at 9:00 a.m., January 24, 1995, in the Hobbs City Hall.

City staff requests representation from your agency to join in a work session to address the issues concerning improper disposal of hazardous chemicals, oils/hydrocarbons and other wastes into the city's environment. The city has had four hazardous chemical/waste incidents in the past several months that have caused significant problems at the Hobbs Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP); hazardous chemicals/oil waste products are being disposed of improperly by those firms that handle said materials.

Problems encountered at the WWTP include the plant being rendered ineffective when bio-processes are destroyed and water effluent contamination which affects ground/surface water discharge areas.

Purposely disposing of or discharging into the sanitary sewer system is a criminal action. The apparent lack of knowledge of city, state and federal laws, regulations and policies governing this particular problem and lack of enforcement also are problems.

The objective of the meeting is educational—to share a wealth of information with and for those in attendance at the planning meeting. An ultimate goal is to develop a program to be presented at a later date to area businesses and industry. Each agency will be requested to make a presentation regarding the particular role and function it performs for proper handling of chemicals and disposal of generated waste and the possible enforcement actions

for non-compliance. I believe this effort will build a stronger intergovernmental/agency cooperation.

The hazardous waste incidents that Hobbs is experiencing seem to be a growing trend. Although the waste is not being generated by the city, the city is responsible for the ever-escalating costs of clean up as the actual offender is rarely found. Local budgets are not endowed with unlimited funds to cover these costs; therefore, a more active enforcement role is needed.

The staff in Hobbs looks forward to your agency's participation in this program which could serve as a model for additional educational programs to be held in other communities.

Please respond to my office to advise whether or not someone from your agency will attend this January 24 meeting.
