Dakota,

The OCD has denied the submitted Deferral Request C-141 for incident # NAB1922539866 for the following reason:

- The division disagrees with COG that the remediation of impacted soil above NMOCD Closure Criteria would result in a major facility deconstruction. Investigation of the release occurred after the tank battery had been removed, and the locations of soil samples collected do not appear to be directly adjacent to any equipment.
- Additional sampling is required. Incident NAB1922539866 occurred over one year before the reported investigation took place, despite the multiple extensions requested to provide time for delineation and work plan/closure report preparation (requested 10/17/2019) and time to inspect the facility and liner integrity and for closure report preparation (requested 01/21/2020). Given this is a high karst area and chloride's tendency to vertically migrate through the soil column, the division is requesting that COG perform a more thorough investigation and collect additional samples in multiple locations at 1' foot intervals to a minimum depth of 4' below ground surface.
