Good afternoon,

This morning, WPX had a spill at the RDX 17-20 well pad; API #3001541381, qtr/qtr A, Sec. 17 T26S R30E. The cause of the spill is mechanical failure; a hose on a charge pump was exposed to constant vibration and developed a hole. Approximately 400 bbls of produced water got spilled with 100 bbls recovered with a vacuum truck. Some of the spilled fluids migrated to the north of the well pad and impacted an area of ~100'x100'.

The C-141 report will be submitted within the next 15 days however, please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
