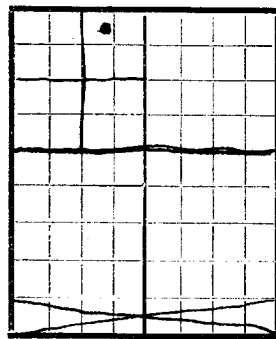

It lists two casing strings: one 10 inch hole with 8 inch casing (24 lb/ft, second hand, 600 ft depth, cemented, 25 sacks) and another 10 inch hole with 6 inch casing (18 lb/ft, second hand, 1730 ft depth, cemented, 50 sacks).

If changes in the above plan become advisable we will notify you before cementing or landing casing. We estimate that the first productive oil or gas sand should occur at a depth of about 1950 feet.
