Dear Mr. Whitfield:

The October 1989 gas proration schedule shows the subject well to be 238,390 MCF overproduced, and, with no apparent allowable, infinitely overproduced.

A review of the Order (R-6415) revealed that the well has a minimum allowable of 1,000 MCFD. Apparently only one month in 1989 (April) has your C-111 been filed soon enough to have the production shown in the proration schedule.

A hurried review of C-115 data indicates the well has produced no more than 1,000 MCFD in any month during 1988 and 1989 to date. It would appear the need to monitor the well and carry it on the proration schedule has run its course and we plan to drop it from future schedules unless there is objection to our doing so.

Should circumstances change such that the well may exceed the minimum limit described in the order, Amoco is hereby instructed to so advise the Director so that appropriate steps may be taken.
