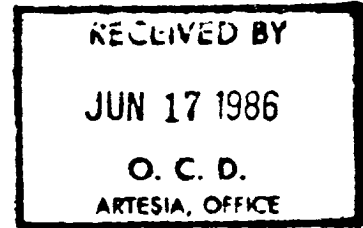


Dear Mr. Clements:

Per your June 12, 1986 conversation with our Bill Duncan, Exxon was notified on June 11, 1986 that the Conoco-operated Turkey Track Booster Station had been shut down on the evening of June 8, 1986 for repairs. The repairs and system modification to the compressor station are expected to last approximately two weeks.

Exxon has five low GOR wells that will be affected, and we request permission to continue to produce them and to flare the associated gas during the shutdown. This letter is to confirm our verbal request and your approval.
