

bear grass, mescal, prairie grass, prairie flowers, and miscellaneous weeds. The only wildlife observed were rabbits and doves, but the area is typical of semi-arid desert land and the wildlife is probably typical of such areas. The ground surface is used for cattle grazing.

- D. There are no ponds, lakes, streams or rivers in the area of the wellsite location.
- E. The nearest occupied dwelling is the mobile home occupied by Bill Smith in Section 2-T24S-R24E, almost three miles from the wellsite. The nearest windmill is about a mile and a half north and east of the wellsite.
- F. Surface ownership: The wellsite is on federally owned surface. Portions of the existing access roads are on state owned surface, with the remainder on federally owned surface.
- G. A mescal pit was observed about 1.6 miles from the wellsite, adjacent to the existing access road, as indicated in paragraph 1B(2), above. No other archeological, historical or cultural sites were observed in the area affected by the wellsite or the access roads.


