On 8-19-93, we perforated the Lower Brushy Canyon "A" and "B" zones from 8112'-8130' and 8146'-8164' with a 4" casing gun (1 spf, 38 total holes). The perfs were acidized with 1500 gals NEFE HCl acid + 50 ball sealers. On 8-21-93, we fraced the perfs with 51,900 gals gelled 2% KCl water + 95,000# 16/30 Ottawa sand and 32,000# 16/30 resin coated sand. The well was opened immediately following the frac for forced closure flowback. Currently, we are recovering the load and testing.
