

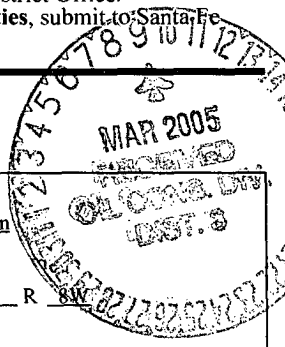

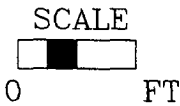

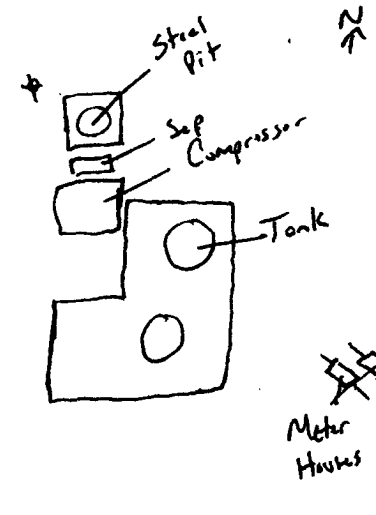

PIT PERIMETER

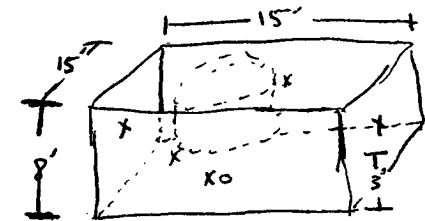




