
Dear Sir:

Reference is made to Geological Survey letters of November 6 and 25, 1933, and to your letter of November 16, 1933 (your reference file 27252 Bond 8-273745 Howard N. Longfellow - U.S.A.), relative to the proper abandonment of the Huntington Park Oil Company Well No. 1, drilled in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 8, T. 30 N., R. 9 W., N.M.M., New Mexico, on oil and gas prospecting permit Santa Fe 047584.

Records of the Geological Survey disclose that the satisfactory abandonment of the above described well was completed January 24, 1934, by day labor, at an actual cost of \$42.10. Accordingly, you are hereby allowed 30 days from receipt of this notice in which to make settlement under your bond for the amount due, \$42.10. Unless settlement is made within the time allowed the entire matter will be referred to the Department of Justice for such action as may be considered appropriate.

Upon receipt of settlement required herein, the Geological Survey will make appropriate report to the General Land Office looking to release of further liability under the \$1,000 assignee's bond, executed July 19, 1927, by Howard N. Longfellow, as principal, and the Royal Indemnity Company, by W. C. Bening, attorney-in-fact, as surety, filed in connection with permit Santa Fe 047584.
