

Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* **On 11-27-08, an MSO was backing up a vehicle on location & struck the well head, knocking off the master valve. Approximately 84 MCF of natural gas was released at the Storey C #12 location as a result. All natural gas was released to the atmosphere. Upon discovery, the location was secured, no fires, no injuries.**

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* **All natural gas was released to the atmosphere. Upon discovery, the location was secured & Production Supervisor and appropriate companies were notified to begin well control. Due to weather conditions the location was inaccessible and well control was regained at 9:30 a.m. on 11-28-08. To prevent reoccurrence, Commentary Driving will be reviewed with MSO.**
