Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* **A ConocoPhillips employee discovered a spill of approximately 5 BBL of crude oil at the Allen Com 1A on 10/06/08 due to a below grade tank overflow. The tank overflow was the result of an oil dump that was stuck shut, allowing the tank to overflow. Upon discovery, the employee shut down the pumping unit and had a vacuum truck recover oil from around the pit. Approximately 4 BBL of oil was recovered and put back into the tank.**

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* **All of the spilled fluids remained on location. The spill impacted soil on the ground surface, in and around the pit. The below grade tank will be removed and affected soils will be excavated. To prevent reoccurrence, COPC repaired oil dump and will continue to monitor performance of oil dump.**
