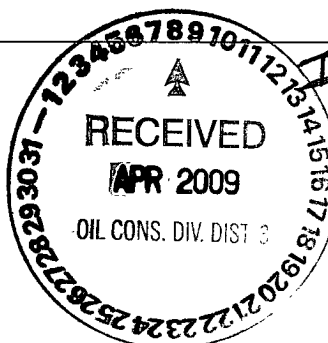
Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* **On April 1, 2009, a COPC employee discovered that a suction & vent valve was left open by a contractor who responded in the early morning to re-start the compressor. Upon discovery the well was shut in & the vent valve was closed. Approximately 150 MCF natural gas was calculated to have been released to the atmosphere at the SJ 30-6 #461.**

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* **All gas was released to the atmosphere. To prevent reoccurrence, COPC will follow up with the contractor & go over COPC correct procedures.**
