

Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.* The 1" valve on the line for the drip tank froze and broke, releasing an unknown amount of natural gas to the atmosphere. The leak was reported to BP by the San Juan County Dispatcher. A BP pumper was dispatched to the well, isolated the leak and repaired the valve. After engineering review on 01/07/2001, the amount of natural gas released was calculated to be approximately 550 Mcf.		
Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.* Approximately 35 gallons of produced water and condensate were also expelled from the drip when the valve broke. The impacted soil is being landfarmed on location.
