Dear Sir:

The reason for the delay in answering your letter dated July 8, 1966 was due to my being on vacation.

My records of the drilling log do not indicate enough detail of the formations drilled to be of any benefit. However, I have this date requested our Durango office to forward to you a copy of the formations obtained from the well samples. Hope this will be of benefit to you.

Mr. Willcoxson, the information pertaining to the drill-stem tests, furnished in my letter of May 5, 1966, is the only information I have as to the depth from surface to water level. On the test of interval 1840' to 1925' the water rose to 690' below surface in 1 hour and on the test of interval 1950' to 1979' the water rose to 550' below surface in 1 hour. The water level might have risen higher if tool had been left open longer; possibly even flowed.

The casing is set 116' below rotary table or approximately 102' below surface of ground.
