
Dear Mr. Goldson:

Per your request of September 6, 1988, we are submitting missing information to you on the wells listed above.

1. The Santa Fe Miguel #1 Well was plugged and abandoned February 17, 1983. Enclosed is a copy of the Sundry notice.
2. The SFPRR #61 was converted to a ranch water well on February 17, 1983. The "Affidavit of Responsibility Conversion to Water-Well" is supplied herewith.
3. The SFPRR #60 has been temporarily abandoned. Form C-104 is included in quadruplicate.
4. The Thomas Drought #2 Well was not purchased by BACA from Capital Oil & Gas Corporation. Capital went into bankruptcy proceedings, so you will need to contact its former president, Gene Pepper. His address is 121 So. Broadway, Ste. 572, Tyler, TX 75702 (214) 592-9981.
5. The State #8 was drilled to a depth of 100', surface pipe was set and nothing more was done. We are enclosing 4 copies of Form C-104. Please note that there is no transporter for this well.
