Introduction

The Division Conservation Archaeology of the San Juan County Museum Association and Fastern New Mexico University recently completed an archaeological clearance survey of National Resource Lands under the authority of the Bureau Of Land Management to be impacted by the scheduled drilling of a gas storage well in the San Ysidro, New Mexico area by Southern Union Production Company. The required field work was accomplished on July 8, 1975.

The survey project was initiated at the request of, and under contract with Southern Union Froduction Commany. It was administered by Roy Shyrcck representing Southern Union Froduction Commany, and by Cynthia Irwin-Williams, who served as the principal investigator for the Division of Conservation Archaeology of the San Juan County Museum Association and Eastern New Mexico University. The field work was conducted by Maurice Montpomery of Fastern New Mexico University, under the Authority of Antiquities Fermit #75-NM-006 (BLM), issued to the Division of Conservation Archaeology by the Bureau of Land Management.

Survey

The area in question involved one well pad location and access road in the San Ysidro, New Mcxico area. The proposed well pad will be located in the Northeast 1 of the Northeast 1 of section 18 Township 15 North, Range 1 East, 800 feet from the North line and 300feet from the Fast line, Sandoval county, New Mexico. (See attached map for this location) The procedure for survey consisted of walking and visually inspecting the proposed access road and well pad.

The proposed well pad will located at an elevation of 5700 feet in an area slightly to the West of Canada de las Milpas wash. It will cover approximately 150 by 250 feet and is located on a gently slopeing plain which drains to the Northeast into Querencia Arroyo. The proposed access road runs generally Northeast along and down a small ridge approximately 2,000 feet where it ties in with proposed well pad. Arroximately 500feet of the proposed access road is located on an old existing access road. This will be marked on the map.

The survey technique consisted of myself walking the area in question and inspecting an area approximately 50 feet wide for the proposed access road. The proposed well pad area was inspected by walking a zig zag pattern accross the proposed area for the well rad. There were no suface indications of any archaeological or historic material on either locations. There are two significant archaeological sites shown in section 19, Township 15 North Range lEast. Neither of these locations should be disturbed due to the secondary effects of construction.

Since neither location showed any surface indication of archaeological or historic resources to be impacted by the proposed construction, it is recommended that clearance for construction be granted immediately.
