
Pursuant to your request, please find enclosed a copy of NMOCD Case No. 8965 and the resultant Order No. R-8289.

ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on August 6, 1986, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Michael E. Stogner.

NOW, on this 28th day of August, 1986, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS THAT:

(1) Due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) The applicant, Mesa Grande Resources, Inc., seeks an order pooling all mineral interests in the Gavilan-Mancos and Gavilan Greenhorn-Graneros-Dakota Oil Pools underlying the S/2 of Section 26, Township 25 North, Range 2 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, forming a standard 320-acre oil spacing and proration unit for both pools.

(3) The applicant has the right to drill and has drilled its Gavilan Well No. 2 at a standard location 1827 feet from the South line and 1846 feet from the East line of said Section 26.

(4) There are interest owners in the proration units who have not agreed to pool their interests.

(5) To avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, to protect correlative rights, to avoid waste, and to afford to the owner of each interest in said units the opportunity to recover or receive without unnecessary expense his just and fair share of the oil in said pools, the subject application

should be approved by pooling all mineral interests, whatever they may be, within said units.

(6) The applicant should be designated the operator of the subject well and units.

(7) Any non-consenting working interest owner should be afforded the opportunity to pay his share of actual well costs to the operator in lieu of paying his share of reasonable well costs out of production.

(8) Any non-consenting working interest owner who does not pay his share of actual well costs should have withheld from production his share of the reasonable well costs plus an additional 200 percent thereof as a reasonable charge for the risk involved in the drilling of the well.

(9) Any non-consenting interest owner should be afforded the opportunity to object to the actual well costs but actual well costs should be adopted as the reasonable well costs in the absence of such objection.

(10) Following determination of reasonable well costs, any non-consenting working interest owner who has paid his share of actual well costs should pay to the operator any amount reasonable well costs exceed actual well costs and should receive from the operator any amount that paid actual well costs exceed reasonable well costs.

(11) \$3,147.00 per month while drilling and \$551.00 per month while producing should be fixed as reasonable charges for supervision (combined fixed rates); the operator should be authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of such supervision charges attributable to each non-consenting working interest, and in addition thereto, the operator should be authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of actual expenditures required for operating the subject well, not in excess of what ~~are~~ reasonable, attributable to each non-consenting working interest.

(12) All proceeds from production from the subject well which are not disbursed for any reason should be placed in escrow to be paid to the true owner thereof upon demand and proof of ownership.

(13) Should all the parties to this forced pooling reach voluntary agreement subsequent to entry of this order, this order shall thereafter be of no further effect.

(14) The operator of the well and units shall notify the Director of the Division in writing of the subsequent voluntary agreement of all parties subject to the forced pooling provisions of this order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

(1) All mineral interests, whatever they may be, in the Gavilan-Mancos and Gavilan Greenhorn-Graneros-Dakota Oil Pools underlying the S/2 of Section 26, Township 25 North, Range 2 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, are hereby pooled to form two standard 320-acre spacing and proration units to be dedicated to the Gavilan Well No. 2 located at a standard location 1827 feet from the South line and 1846 feet from the East line of said Section 26.

(2) Mesa Grande Resources, Inc. is hereby designated the operator of the subject well and units.

(3) Within 30 days after the effective date of this order, the operator shall furnish each known non-consenting working interest owner in the subject units an itemized schedule of actual well costs.

(4) Within 30 days from the date the schedule of actual well costs is furnished to him, any non-consenting working interest owner shall have the right to pay his share of actual well costs to the operator in lieu of paying his share of reasonable well costs out of production, and any such owner who pays his share of actual well costs as provided above shall remain liable for operating costs but shall not be liable for risk charges.

(5) The actual well costs as submitted at the hearing shall be the reasonable well costs; provided however, if there is any objection to actual well costs within 60 days after entry of this order the Division will determine reasonable well costs after public notice and hearing.

(6) Within 60 days following determination of reasonable well costs, any non-consenting working interest owner who has paid his share of actual well costs in advance, as provided above, shall pay to the operator his pro rata share of the amount that reasonable well costs exceed actual well costs and shall receive from the operator his pro rata share of the amount that the actual well costs exceed reasonable well costs.

(7) The operator is hereby authorized to withhold the following costs and charges from production:

- (A) The pro rata share of reasonable well costs attributable to each non-consenting working interest owner who has not paid his share of actual well costs within 30 days from the date the schedule of actual well costs is furnished to him.
- (B) As a charge for the risk involved in the drilling of the well, 200 percent of the pro rata share of reasonable well costs attributable to each non-consenting working interest owner who has not paid his share of actual well costs within 30 days from the date the schedule of actual well costs is furnished to him.
- (8) The operator shall distribute said costs and charges withheld from production to the parties who advanced the well costs.
- (9) \$3,147.00 per month while drilling and \$551.00 per month while producing are hereby fixed as reasonable charges for supervision (combined fixed rates); the operator is hereby authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of such supervision charges attributable to each non-consenting working interest, and in addition thereto, the operator is hereby authorized to withhold from production the proportionate share of actual expenditures required for operating such well, not in excess of what are reasonable, attributable to each non-consenting working interest.
- (10) Any unsevered mineral interest shall be considered a seven-eighths (7/8) working interest and a one-eighth (1/8) royalty interest for the purpose of allocating costs and charges under the terms of this order.
- (11) Any well costs or charges which are to be paid out of production shall be withheld only from the working interest's share of production, and no costs or charges shall be withheld from production attributable to royalty interests.
- (12) All proceeds from production from the subject well which are not disbursed for any reason shall immediately be placed in escrow in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, to be paid to the true owner thereof upon demand and proof of ownership; the operator shall notify the Division of the name and address of said escrow agent within 30 days from the date of first deposit with said escrow agent.
- (13) Should all parties to this forced pooling reach voluntary agreement subsequent to entry of this order, this order shall thereafter be of no further effect.
- (14) The operator of the well and units shall notify the Director of the Division in writing of the subsequent voluntary agreement of all parties subject to the forced pooling provisions of this order.
