

Administrative Order NSL-4679

Dear Mr. Wood:



Pursuant to the well location requirements of the "Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-10987-B, dated June 30, 2000, as amended by Division Order No. R-10987-B (1), dated August 10, 2000, the proposed well is considered to be standard for the 320-acre Dakota gas spacing and proration unit, but, pursuant to Division Rule 104.B (1) is unorthodox within the 40-acre Gallup oil unit.

This application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F, revised by Division Order No. R-11231, issued by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission in Case No. 12119 on August 12, 1999.

It appears that the SE/4 of Section 22, S/2 of Section 23, all of Section 26, E/2 of Section 27, NE/4 of Section 34, and N/2 of Section 35, all in Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico comprises a single Jicarilla Apache tribal oil and gas lease (BIA No. 13) with common mineral ownership; therefore, there are no adversely effected offset mineral interests to the subject 40-acre tract.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F (2) the above-described unorthodox Gallup oil well location within the above-described 40-acre standard oil spacing and proration unit for the proposed Jicarilla Apache "C" Well No. 4 is hereby approved.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
