ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m.  
on September 30, 1959, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before  
Daniel S. Nutter, Examiner duly appointed by the Oil  
Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter re-  
ferred to as the "Commission," in accordance with Rule  
1214 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

NOW, on this 19<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1959, the  
Commission, a quorum being present, having considered  
the application, the evidence adduced, and the recom-  
mendations of the Examiner, Daniel S. Nutter, and being  
fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as  
required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this  
cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant is the operator of the  
Jicarilla "S" Well No. 16-2, located in the SW/4 SW/4  
of Section 2, Township 24 North, Range 4 West, T14N, R10W, Rio  
Arriba County, New Mexico.

(3) That the applicant proposes to dually complete  
the above-described Jicarilla "S" Well No. 16-2 in such a  
manner as to permit the production of oil from an undesign-  
ated Gallup oil pool and the production of oil from an  
undesignated Dakota oil pool through parallel strings of  
2-3/8 inch tubing.

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(4) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and in accord with good conservation practices.

(5) That approval of the proposed dual completion will neither cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete the Jicarilla "5" well No. 10-2, located in the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 2, Township 24 North, Range 4 West, NMPA, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from an undesignated Gallup oil pool and the production of oil from an undesignated Dakota oil pool through parallel strings of 2-3/8 inch tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter on the approximate anniversary date of the well's completion.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, after proper notice and hearing the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
