DETAILS OF WORK

Drilled 8 5/8" and reamed to 13 3/4" hole to 241' KB. Ran 9 5/8" Armo, 32.3#, H-40 casing landed at 234' KB and cemented w/175 sax 2% CACL Cement. Pumped plug to 222' KB. Waited 24 hours, drilled out cement and tested casing w/750 PSI for 30 minutes. Held OK.

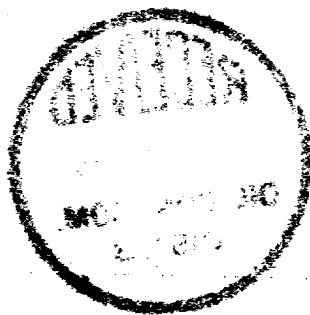
