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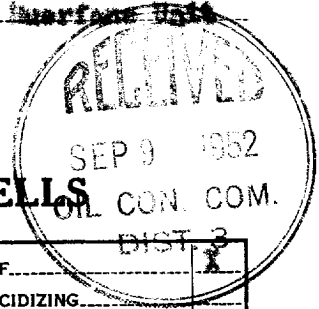

DETAILS OF WORK

On August 29, 1952, 5-1/2" casing was landed at 2046 feet and cemented with 100 sacks of cement. Plug down at 8:30 P.M., August 29, 1952. At 4:00 A.M., August 31, 1952, casing and water shut-off were tested at 800 pounds pump pressure for 30 minutes. No drop in pressure. Thirty-eight feet of solid cement were drilled in bottom of pipe and water shut-off was tested at 800 pounds for 30 minutes. No drop in pressure. Drilling operations were resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
