**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on February 9, 1972, for permission to dually complete its Reid Well No. 18 located in Unit K of Section 18, Township 28 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 25th day of February, 1972, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waivers of objection have been received from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with in this instance.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Reid Well No. 18 located in Unit K of Section 18, Township 28 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

THE APPLICATION OF THE NEW MEXICO OIL & GAS COMMISSION
 FOR A DUAL REGISTRATION OF THE
 DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
 ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
 BY THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Article 11 of the Constitution of the United States, the Commission has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the application of the New Mexico Oil & Gas Commission, dated February 9, 1932, for permission to drill, operate and lease well No. 1, located in Unit 1 of Section 12, Township 38 North, Range 1 East, N.M.P.M., New Mexico, in such manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Maverick pool and the Basin-Pecos pool.

Now, on this 15th day of February, 1932, the Secretary of the Commission finds:

(1) That application has been made, filed under the name of Unit 1-A of the Commission's title and registration.

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operations of these wells have been conducted and

(3) That waivers of objection have been received from all existing operators and the waiver period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with in this instance.

(4) That the proposed well and the lease will not cause water or mineral curtailment rights.

(5) That the resolution of the proposed well development is feasible and consistent with good conservation principles.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, known as the Gas Company, do and the same is hereby authorized to drill, operate and lease well No. 1, located in Unit 1 of Section 12, Township 38 North, Range 1 East, N.M.P.M., New Mexico, in such manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Maverick pool and the Basin-Pecos pool, under the following conditions:

First, however, that applicant shall maintain a record and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Article 11-A.

Second, that applicant shall keep books-records and make upon completion and annually thereafter.

Third, that the Commission is hereby authorized to make cause as necessary for the entry of said well, and as the Commission may deem necessary.
