Dear Ms. Maddox:

Reference is made to your recent application for an amendment to Division Order No. DHC-1262 dated May 23, 1996, which order authorized Amoco Production Company to downhole commingle Aztec-Pictured Cliffs and Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool production within the subject well, to change the allocation percentages for the subject pools within the wellbore.

It appears that the production data submitted with your application supports the proposed amendment to the production allocation.

The maximum amount of gas which may be produced daily from the well shall be determined by Division Rules and Regulations or by the gas allowable for each respective prorated pool as printed in the Division's San Juan Basin Gas Proration Schedule.

Assignment of allowable to the subject well and allocation of production from the subject well shall be as follows:

Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool	Oil 0%	Gas 52%
Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool	Oil 100%	Gas 48%

REMARKS: The operator shall notify the Aztec District Office of the Division upon implementation of the commingling process.
