Re: Application for administrative approval dated February 12, 2002 (application reference No. pKRVo-204552548) for Energen Resources Corporation ("Energen") to drill its proposed San Juan "30-4" Unit Well No. 102 at an off-pattern unorthodox coal gas well location within a non-standard219.04-acre gas spacing unit in the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool comprising the W/2 equivalent (Lots 1 through 4 and the E/2 W/2) of Section 18, Township 30 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County,

Dear Mr. Corcoran:

I have reviewed your request for the subject unorthodox off-pattern coal gas well and the records of the Division for wells in the immediate area. You stated in your application, "it is not possible to locate a well in the NE/4 of Section 18". The proposed well is for a spacing unit that comprises the W/2 equivalent of Section 18 and therefore does not affected the NE/4 of Section 18. It was further mentioned that the U. S. Forest Service requested Energen to locate the proposed well on an existing well pad in order to minimize disturbance to wildlife and vegetation. The Energen operated San Juan "30-4" Unit Well No. 1 (API No. 30-39-07840) in Unit "N" of Section 18 appears to provide such a well pad within the appropriate quarter section for this stand-up unit just as well as Energen's San Juan "30-4" Unit Well No. 39 (API No. 30-039-22210) in Unit "F" of Section 18.

Your request for the proposed unorthodox coal gas well location is unwarranted. Deemed unnecessary, it is hereby **denied** and is being returned to you at this time.

Should you wish to pursue this application for this particular off-pattern coal gas well location further, you may reapply for a hearing before a daily appointed examiner.

Dear Mr. Stogner:

Energen Resources Corporation requests administrative approval of an unorthodox location and non-standard proration unit for its San Juan 30-4 Unit #102 well under the provisions of NMOCD R-8768.

The proposed well is to be located 1,450' FNL & 710' FWL of Section 18-T30N-R4W, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico and dedicated to a non-standard gas spacing unit consisting of the W/2 of said section 18, in the Basin Fruitland Coal gas pool.

All of section 18-T30N-R4W is dedicated to the San Juan 30-4 Unit (approved by the NMOCD), which provides in part that wells drilled to the Mesaverde and shallower formations shall be dedicated to E/2 or W/2 drilling blocks. Section 18 is irregular in size with the W/2 being made up of Lot 1 (NW NW) 14.73 acres, Lot 2 (SW NW) 14.75 acres, Lot 3 (NW SW) 14.77 acres, Lot 4 (SW SW) 14.79 acres, and E/2 W/2 totaling 219.04 acres which is less than 70% of 320 acres (219.04/320=68.45%) as required in the Basing Fruitland Coal Pool Rule 5.

As it is not possible to locate a well in the NE/4 of Section 18, due to steep terrain, off pattern locations in the NW/4 and SE/4 will be necessary. Further at the request of the Forest Service to locate our proposed San Juan 30-4 Unit #102 well on an existing well pad and thereby minimize disturbance to wildlife and vegetation, along with extremely rough terrain in the NE/4 of Section 18 it is necessary to request an unorthodox (off pattern) location.

The proposed location will be on the same well pad as the San Juan 30-4 Unit #39 (MV) well located 1,520' FNL & 720' FWL of Section 18-T30N-R4W, NMPM.

Energen Resources Corporation as operator of the San Juan 30-4 Unit intends to drill seven unit wells during the 2001 season (April 1 through November 1, 2001) and three (3) non unit wells within this area. A plan of development for the San Juan 30-4 Unit setting out our drilling plans will be submitted in February of 2002.

A copy of this application is being submitted to offset operators by certified mail with a request that they furnish your office in Santa Fe with a Waiver of Objection.







RE: Unorthodox location for wells:

The Jicarilla Ranger District, Carson National Forest is requesting you apply for two unorthodox locations as follows, as discussed by your company representative, and John Reidinger of this office:

Bullridge Well #100, T. 32 N., R. 5 W. Sec. 33, 1195'FSL/845'FEL San Juan 30-4 Well #102, T. 30 N., R. 4 W. Sec. 18, 1450'FNL/710'FWL

The mineral operator is required to comply with other applicable regulations such as the Endangered Species Act and the Archeological Resources Protection Act under 36 CFR 228.112(c). The operator is also required under 36 CFR 228.108(c) to minimize or prevent damage to surface resources. The Carson National Forest Management Plan states that surface resource impacts will be minimized when administering mineral resources.

The following conditions apply which require unorthodox locations:

Prevention of unnecessary resource damage requires the locations be unorthodox. (Such as a previously disturbed area or existing road available outside the drilling window.)
