Reference is made to your application for approval of an unorthodox well location for your Hageood No. 22-G Well to be located 660 feet from the South line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 20, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, Basin-Dakota Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.

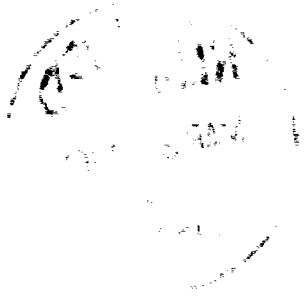
