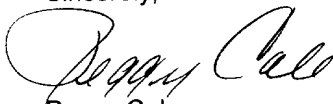
The above referenced well is a Chacra/Mesaverde/Gallup commingle. Attached is a copy of the allocation for the commingling of the subject well completed on April 17, 2002. DHC-2972 was issued for this well.

Gas: Gallup 0%
Mesaverde 65%
Chacra 35%

Oil: Gallup 100%
Mesaverde 0%
Chacra 0%

The existing Gallup formation is an oil producer. Because the two formations added are gas producers, the percentages are based upon separator tests done during workover operations. Because the oil production did not increase with the addition of the Chacra and Mesaverde formations, oil production remains allocated solely to the Gallup formation.
