#### Dear Frank:

Tenneco's City of Farmington Com lE DK well was first delivered February 16, 1988. The gas purchaser is the City of Farmington's Animas Plant. Since first delivery we have unsuccessfully attempted to conduct the initial deliverability test on the well due to problems with the power plant. Tenneco has been informed that the plant will be down until approximately April 25, 1988, postponing our initial deliverability test until that time.

Since it will likely be impossible for Tenneco to conduct the test during the ninety days following turn-on, it is requested that an exception to the ninety-day period be made in this case allowing Tenneco to conduct the test as soon as possible following plant start-up. Please inform Tenneco with your decision on this matter as soon as possible.
