
Reference is made to your application dated March 24, 1995 for a non-standard Blanco-Mesaverde infill gas well location on an existing 367.96-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration unit ("GPU") for said Blanco-Mesaverde Pool comprising all of irregular of Section 5, Township 31 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. Said GPU was authorized by Division Administrative Order NWU-434, dated October 18, 1961, and currently has dedicated thereon the Rosa Unit Well No. 41 (API No. 30-039-07981), located at a standard gas well location 1500 feet from the South line and 1528 feet from the West line (Unit K) of said Section 5.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox infill gas well location in said Section 5 is hereby approved:

Rosa Unit Well No. 41A
2180' FSL - 1485' FEL (Unit J) 5-31N-5W

Further, Northwest Pipeline is hereby authorized to dedicate Blanco-Mesaverde gas production on the subject GPU from both the Rosa Unit Well Nos. 41 and 41A. Said wells and GPU will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to the prorated gas pools in Northwest New Mexico.
