Drilled 7-7/8" hole to 7035'. Cemented 7022' of 5 1/2" OD 14#, 15.5# and 17# casing at 7035' in two stages with DV tool set at 2601'. Cemented first stage through float collar with 500 sacks of 30:50 Pozmix with 4% gel added. Cemented second stage through DV tool at 2601' with 150 sacks of 30:50 Pozmix with 4% gel added. Cement circulated from 2601' to surface. Tested casing with 1500 psi for 30 minutes before drilling out DV tool. Casing tested ok. After drilling out DV tool tested casing with 1500 psi for 30 minutes. Casing tested ok. Drilled out float collar, cement and new hole from 7035' to 7048'.



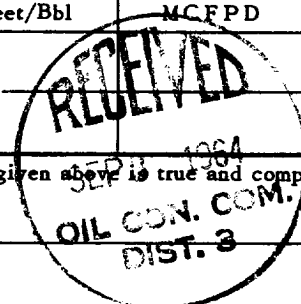
