Dear Mr. Porter:

We hereby submit application to co-mingle condensate from the Dakota and Mesaverde Formation into common storage in accordance with Rules 303 and 309B, New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.

The Dakota zone produces $\frac{0}{1/2}$ barrels of condensate per MMCF and the Mesaverde zone produces $\frac{1/2}{1}$ barrels of condensate per MMCF. We propose to allocate production, if any, back to each zone according to semiannual GOR tests to be reported on Form C-116. Ownership is common between zones.

Attached is a sketch outlining the hook-up of production equipment.
