DETAILS OF WORK

Ute Mountain Tribal "C" Well No. 3. Moved in pulling unit on March 6, 1959, pulled tubing and rods. Ran 5-1/2" Hookwall packer with 96' tail pipe and set packer at 4095'. Acidized with 3000 gallons 15% acid. Maximum treating pressure 700 pounds. Pulled packer and cleaned out to plug back depth. Ran tubing and rods and put well on pump. Well acidized due to possibility of damage to fractured pay zone during cement operations. Ute Mountain Tribal "C" Well No. 3 was completed as pumping oil well Verde-Gallup field March 19, 1959. Potential test March 17, 1959, pumped 23 barrels of oil in 24 hours with 14 - 42" strokes per minute with 1-1/2" pump. Gas oil ratio not yet available.
