Dear Mr. Harvey:

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has completed a review of Williams Field Services' (WFS) February 11, 2002 "RANDLEMAN #1 PIT REMEDIATION AND CLOSURE REPORT". This document contains the results of WFS soil and ground water remediation activities for an unlined pit site in the San Juan Basin at which ground water contamination was discovered. The document requests closure of the site since ground water has been remediated to below New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) standards as demonstrated in 4 consecutive sampling events. The document also proposes to plug and abandon the site ground water monitoring wells.

The pit closure/remediation activities and proposed monitor well plugging and abandonment for the site listed below are approved on the condition that that the monitor wells are plugged and abandoned by cutting the casing off below ground surface and filling the annulus from bottom to top with a cement grout containing 3-5% bentonite.

1. Randleman #1 (Dehy pit)

Unit K, Sec. 13, T31N, R11W.
