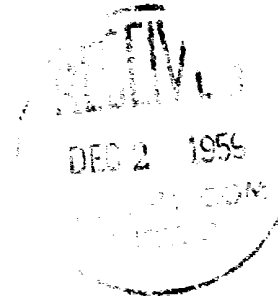


THE APPLICATION OF CONSOLIDATED OIL & GAS, INC. FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS GOVERNMENT-STARR WELL NO. 1-13 LOCATED IN THE SE/4 SW/4 OF SECTION 13, TOWNSHIP 31 NORTH, RANGE 13 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE BLANCO-MESAVERDE POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM AN UNDESIGNATED DAKOTA POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 2, 1959, for permission to dually complete its Government-Starr Well No. 1-13 located in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 13, Township 31 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 23rd day of November, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

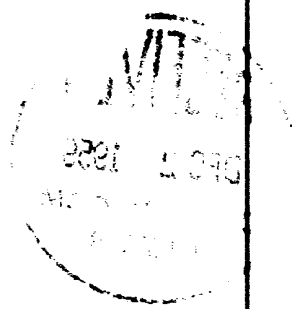
That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Government--Starr Well No. 1-13 located in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 13, Township 31 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Dakota Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders

Range 13 West, T14M, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as
to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool and the
production of gas from an understated Dakota Pool.

Now, on the 13th day of November, 1954, the Secretary-Director

finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of
Sub-section (c) of Rule 11-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all
operators of offset wells have been duly notified, and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting
period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed well completion will not cause waste nor
infringe on the correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed well completion are
feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THE ORDER OF THE COMMISSION:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and
the same is hereby authorized to drill and operate its Government-Start Well
No. 1-12 located in the SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 31 North, Range 13
West, T14M, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit
the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool and the production of
gas from an understated Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate,
and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule
11-A, as amended by Order 8-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take proper leakage
tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability
Test Period for the Dakota Zone.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is
hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders
