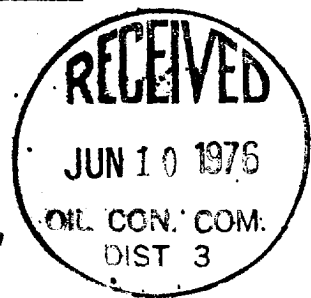
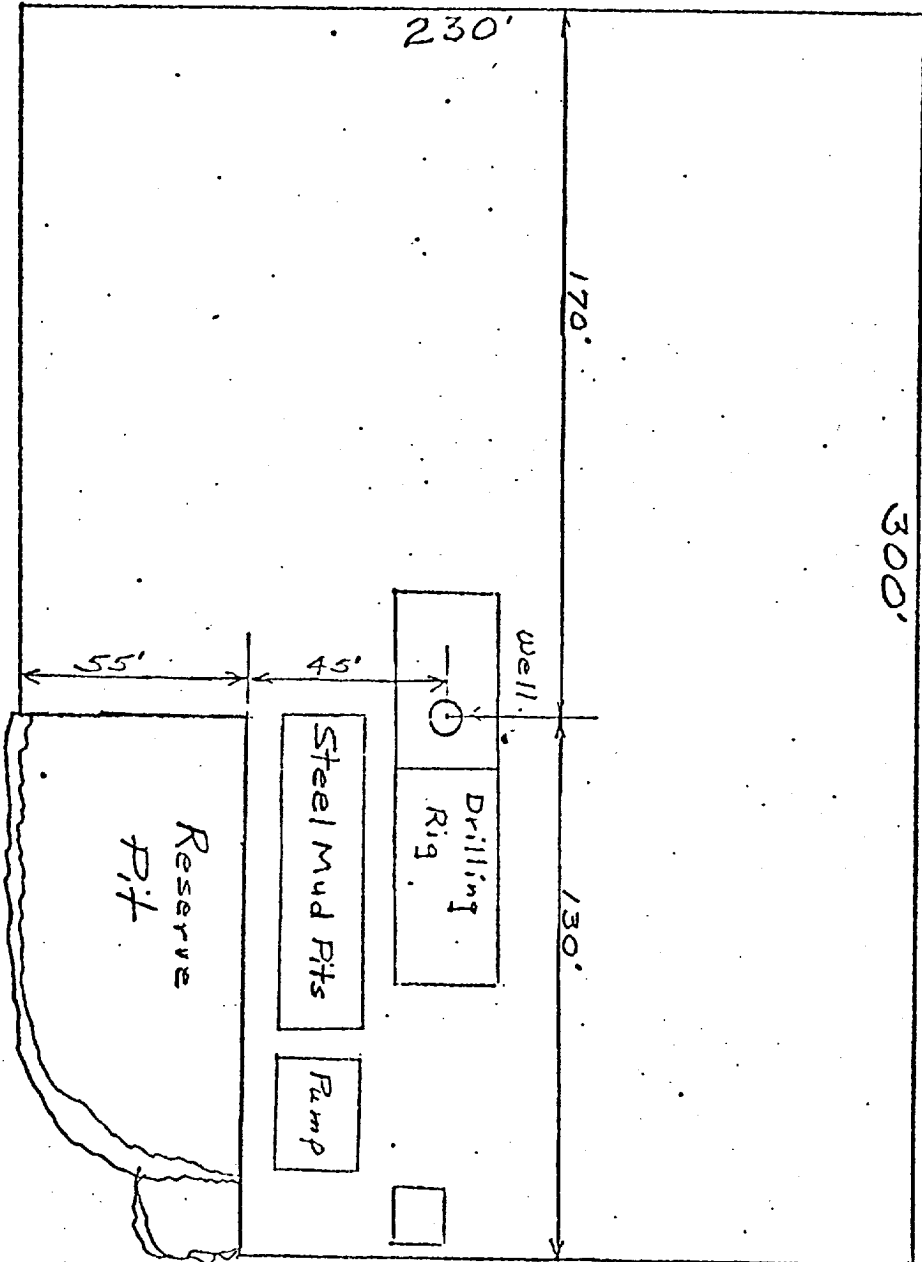


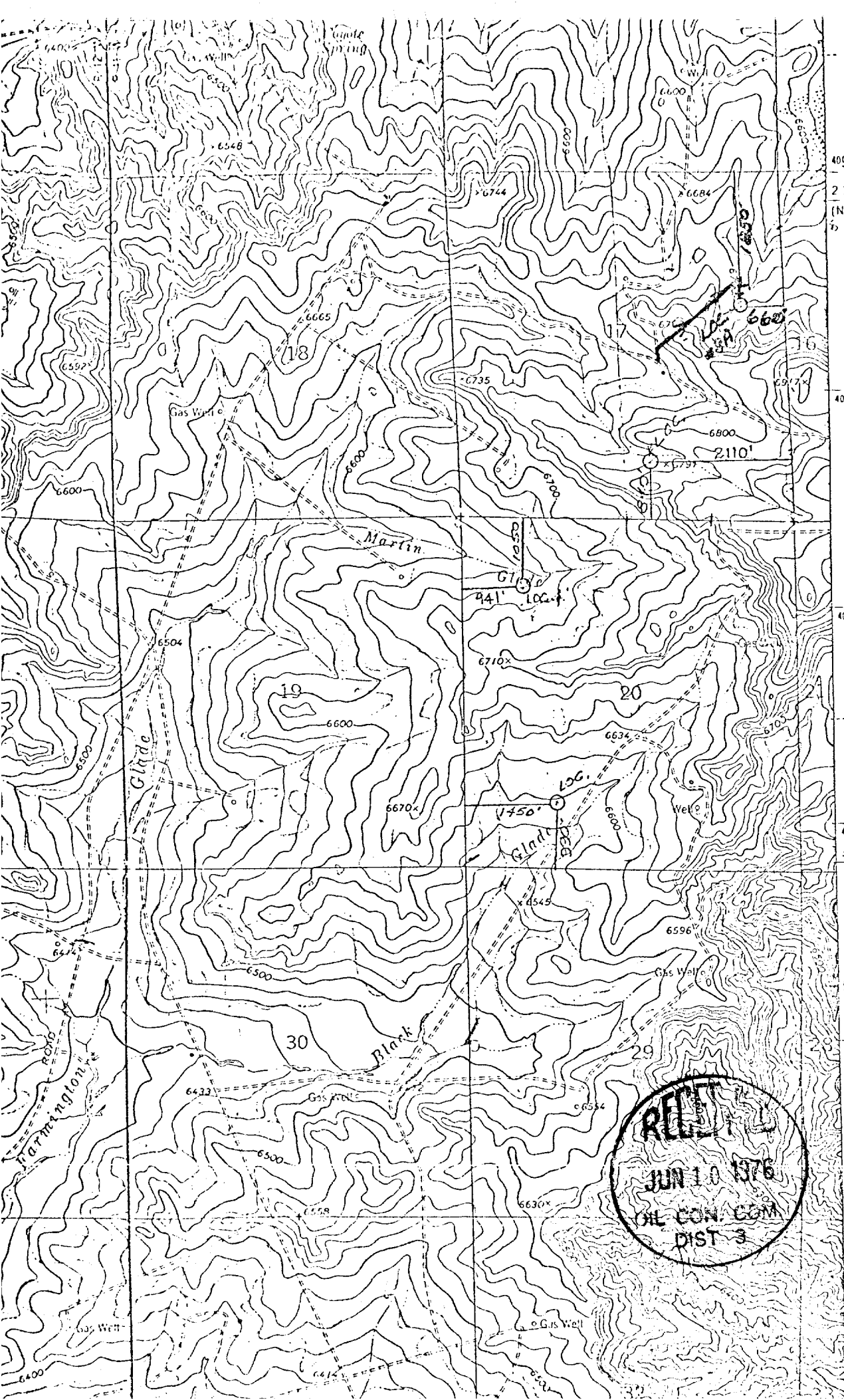
LOCATION AND EQUIPMENT LAYOUT

PROPOSED PIPELINE.

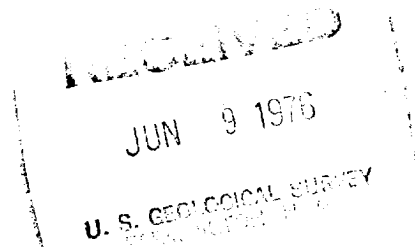

Gentlemen:

Information regarding existing roads, pipelines, flowlines etc., relative to the above well location are included on the enclosed attachments.

Water for drilling and completion operation, will be obtained from a water hole located in the SE/4, NW/4, Sec. 29, T32N R10W.

Waste disposal will be in the burn pit, toilet, or reserve pit. There will be no camp or airstrip associated with drilling this well. Upon completion or abandonment of this well the location will be cleaned, leveled, and a dry hole marker placed, if applicable.

This is an unorthodox location due to the non-standard drilling tract which was approved by the New Mexico Oil and Gas Conservation Commission in 1956 (see Exhibit "A" attached).

Application for permit to drill at an unorthodox location has been filed with the NMOCC in Santa Fe, and the permit should be approved without hearing within three weeks.
