

THE APPLICATION OF PALMER OIL
& GAS COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-2293

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Palmer Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on December 2, 1976, for permission to dually complete its Federal Well No. 1-1 located in Unit L of Section 1, Township 31 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 8th day of December, 1976, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

(3) That waivers of objection have been received from such offsetting operators.

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Palmer Oil and Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Federal Well No. 1-1 located in Unit L of Section 1, Township 31 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
