Reference is made to your No. 2 Trail Canyon well, located in ~~SE 1/4~~ sec. 18,
T. 32 N., R. 8 W., San Juan County, New Mexico, on Federal lease NM-33055.


On March 7, 1983, we received a request to set a retrievable bridge plug above the Gallup and to perforate and test the Mesaverde. On July 1, 1983, we received a Sundry Notice indicating the work had been completed, and plans were to shut in the Gallup for production determinations on the Mesaverde. On February 9, 1984, we received two Dispatcher's Well Reports for disconnecting the Gallup and hooking up the Mesaverde.

Within 15 days of receipt of this letter, you are requested to submit to us, your plans for the Gallup zone. If you plan to temporarily abandon the Gallup zone, the following conditions must be met:

1. Justification of the reason the well (or zone) should be temporarily abandoned rather than permanently plugged and abandoned.
2. A complete record of perforations in the well casing.
3. Provide for the installation of a bridge plug or a cement plug no more than 50 feet above each set of open perforations. (A diagram attached to your Mesaverde Completion Report indicates 4 1/2" casing set at 7559 and a Lock-Set packer set at 7500 feet and capped with 40 feet of sand.)

If, however you plan to produce the Gallup in the future, please advise.
