Dear Dick:

Charlie Jenkins has moved a rig into McKinley County and spudded a well where, to the best of my knowledge, the description is the Southeast Quarter of Section 3, Township 14 North, Range 10 West, and I think on Santa Fe-Pacific Railroad land. They have set 16 feet of 16 inch surface casing and cemented to the surface. Total depth now 65 feet. We have not received in this office any Notice of Intention to Drill from Mr. Jenkins or anyone else.

Thinking it possible that Charlie might have sent a Notice of Intention to Drill to the Santa Fe Office, I am sending a copy of this letter to him addressed at the Franciscan Hotel in Albuquerque, which is the only address that I have. If you know anything further regarding this location, please advise us.

It may be that this well is drilled by Jenkins & McQueen who at one time had a blanket bond in the state of New Mexico, but I am not sure as to whether this bond is still in effect or not. This, of course, you can check in the office at Santa Fe.

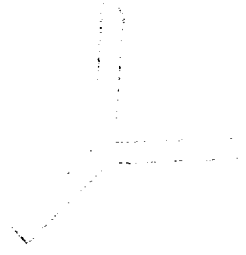
