Dear Mr. Hatch:

The above well was drilled in 1952 and a well record form, C-105, was filed with this office indicating that the well was drilled through the Pictured Cliffs formation and $4\frac{1}{2}$ inch casing was cemented at 1400 feet with 200 sacks of cement. The operator estimated a potential of 175 MCF from a producing zone in the Farmington Sandstone. The well was temporarily abandoned and has never been connected. After this length of time, we presume that the operator does not intend to produce the well. I therefore recommend that a hearing be set at a date not sooner than thirty days nor later than sixty days from this date to have the operator and the bonding company show cause why this well should not be plugged and abandoned in accordance with New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission rules and regulations.

I am sending the operator and the bonding company a copy of this letter so that the operator will have an opportunity to contact us prior to the time that a hearing has actually been set in the event that the operator chooses to contact us and plug the well rather than go to a hearing.
