Gentlemen:

The following information is submitted in compliance with your letter dated March 30, 1955, and Memorandum on Non-Standard Gas Proration Units for Pictured Cliffs Gas Pools, Order R-565, Rule 6(b):

1. The Thompson #1 well is located 220 feet from the South line and 1520 feet from the West line of Section 10, Township 30 North, Range 11 West, N.M.P.M., in the Aztec Pictured Cliffs Pool.

2. The proposed non-standard unit comprises forty acres and in this connection attention is called to the fact that said well was completed September 4, 1941, at which time the present spacing requirements were not in effect. It was tied into the Southern Union Gas Company line September 11, 1951.

3. The proposed non-standard proration unit lies wholly within a single governmental section.

4. The entire unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas.

5. The acreage to the West of the unit lies within the Town limits of the Town of Aztec and a copy of this letter is being sent to said Town as well as to all offset operators, by registered mail, to advise them of the intent to form this non-standard unit.

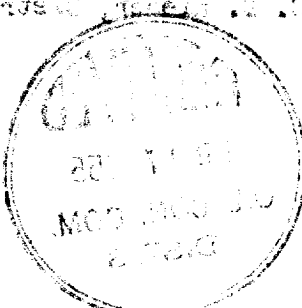
